COMMUNITY AFFAIRS CORNER - "CARE TO SHARE"

This is going to be a new regular feature column in TOPICS.

IT IS GOING TO BE ABOUT INFORMATION, such as on education, health, employment opportunities, recreation, income maintenance and other topical fare; where to get it, what to do with it, once you've got it and how to follow it up.

INFORMATION ABOUT - Government Departments, their do's and don'ts, what you're entitled to and what you can't get, and how to go about getting what you're entitled to (except MEDIBANK they don't know themselves).

INFORMATION ABOUT the doings of people or organizations elsewhere, which could be an idea to have in Leigh Creek: such as the self help effort of the youth of Proserpine, Qld., who needed something to do, something to get involved in which would keep them from being bored. So they got together, formed their own Proserpine Youth Club and, with the help of some adults, organised their own activities. These included dances, camping trips, fund raising stunts and other projects. As a side benefit they managed to renovate an old building for their own den-cum-coffee-lounge.

INFORMATION ABOUT fund raising and grantmanship (which, as everyone in the trade knows, is the gentle art of "screwing money out of the Government or out of large philanthropic organizations") for any worthwhile project.

IT IS GOING TO BE ABOUT WELFARE -- Welfare means different things to different people. This may be a trite phrase, but it seems applicable to the region. Opinions range from the idea that "welfare is for blackfellows and bludgers" to a real understanding of the problems of Aborigines and other disadvantaged people. Generally speaking, although there is little stigma applied to welfare, it is also apparent that some are unaware what welfare is all about and that to a certain extent, we are all benefiting of one kind of "welfare" or another and that real welfare has very little to do with income.

IT IS GOING TO BE ABOUT INVOLVEMENT - people helping people, to make Leigh Creek and the Region a more pleasant place to live in - INVOLVEMENT, such as the hard work being done by the committee people on the town's various health, welfare, recreation, education and sporting organizations.

BUT MOST OF ALL, it is hoped that this column is going to be a forum, where people can exchange ideas about what they feel they would like to see Leigh Creek and the Far North, a place to GET INVOLVED, to DO something, or to help others do something.

One of our 'locals' wrote recently to Mr C R Kelly (Member for Wakefield) expressing concern about the cuts in the rail services to Leigh Creek. Mr Kelly wrote to the ANR Commission about this and below is a copy of the answer to this letter:-

"Dear Mr Kelly,

I refer to your letter of 23 April 1976 forwarding copies of correspondence from of Leigh Creek.

You are probably aware that the twice weekly 'Ghan' passenger service which operated between Adelaide and Alice Springs prior to recent serious floods on the Central Australia Railway has been reduced to a weekly service since the re-introduction of services on this line some 2 weeks ago. This was due to limitations forced on the Commission by flood damage on the narrow gauge section but has resulted in a similar diminution of services on the standard gauge.

The temporary rail car service mentioned by was provided whilst the 'through' service was out of action and the poor use of this service by Leigh Creek residents illustrates the problem experienced by the Commission in providing passenger services to serve locations such as Leigh Creek. might be interested in a comparison of the costs of providing the temporary service which amounted to \$2,950.00. Revenue from the services concerned was \$215.00.

These figures are indicative of similar results experienced by the Commission and the former Commonwealth Railways in the provision of passenger services on this line over a period of many years.

The Commission is required to act as a business undertaking and, as such, is not in a position to subsidise passenger services to localities such as Leigh Creek, the majority of whose residents have clearly shown that they are not prepared to use such services.

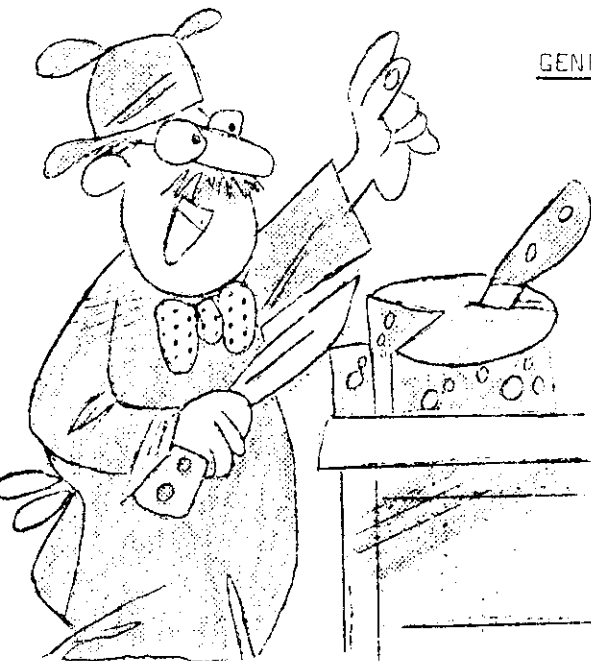

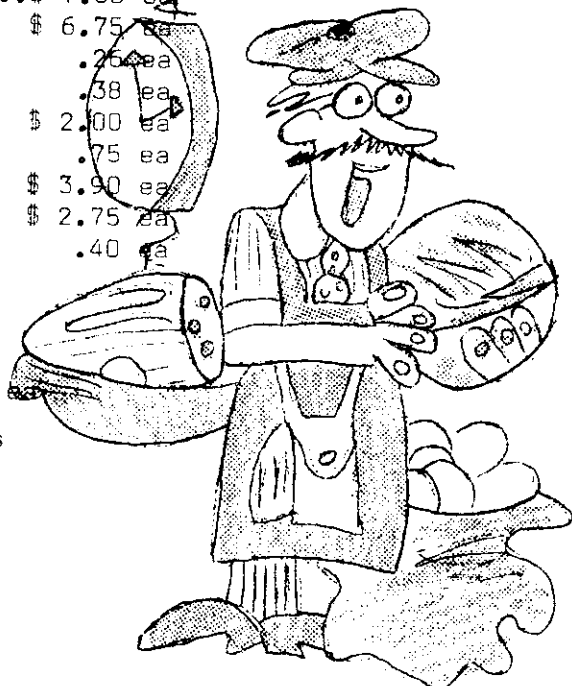

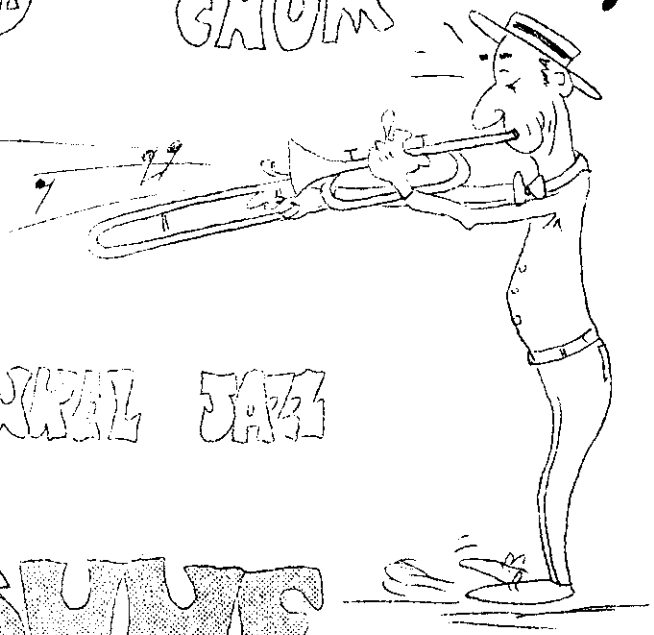
