





#### PRUNING

The group of plants What loose all their leaves in Winter are referred to as deciduous. They have usually come from cold to cold temperature regions of the world where they frequently experience very cold Winters, with frosts and snow. Soft leafy plants have difficulty surviving in this type of environment as the water in each of the tiny leaf cells expands and burst the cells on freezing. This is the same as happens to water pipes in winter or a bottle of beer left in the freezer. Over millions of years plants that live in this type of environment developed a protection against the cold, by throwing off all their soft leaves before the temperature drops low enough to kill them. Before it drops its leaves, it moves most of the plant food in its leaves back into the woody stems and roots, then slows down its system and goes to sleep. The woody stems and roots contain little water & their cells are thick and can withstand the winter quite OK.

With all the stored food in the woody parts of the plant, and the plant almost asleep, this is the time to prune these They should not be pruned before all the leaves are gone, as they are not ready to heal the wounds and nor are they asleep. Dormancy is like an anaesthetic. Please don't operate on



your plants before they're out to it.

NEXT TOPICS - Pruning young deciduous TREES. Hold your fire tree pruners, give the patient a chance to drop off.







IMAGES OF ROSE by Anna Gilbert. Into a tranquil home in the 1880's comes mystery and menace to hold you to the last page.


