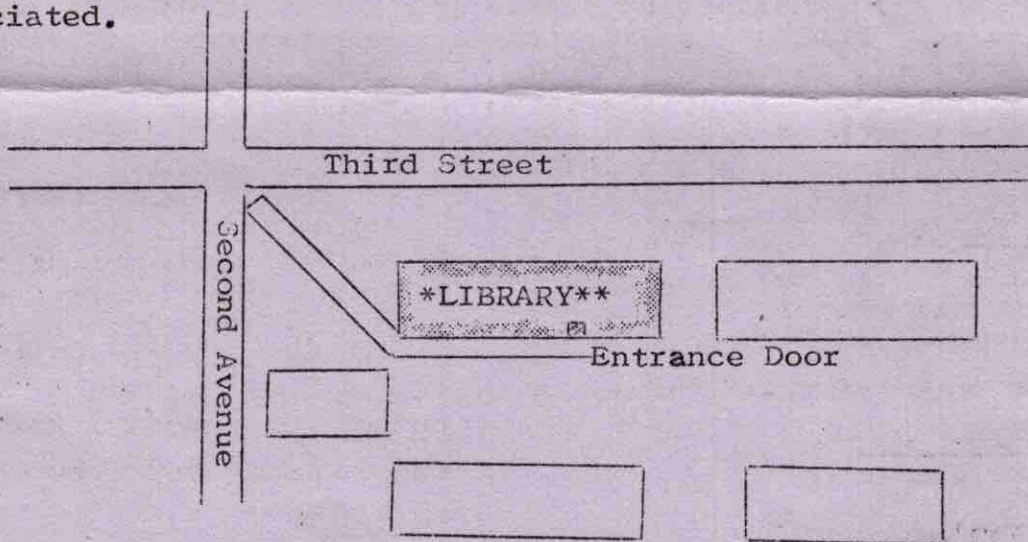

Mr Mussared has been appointed to Adelaide as Chief Design Engineer and will be taking up his new position shortly.

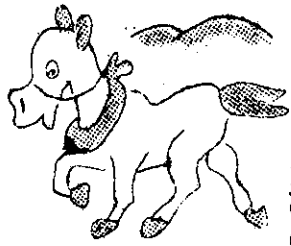
Peter & Nell are visiting Leigh Creek on Thursday and Friday and a farewell has been arranged for them TONIGHT (6th June) 1974.

Dear Minister,

Thank you for your letter of the 10th April, 1974 about the provision of a television service to Leigh Creek.

The possibility of providing a television service by means of a video-tape repeater station at Leigh Creek has been examined by the Electricity Trust of South Australia but the cost to the Trust is considered to be excessive. Although Leigh Creek township was established for coal mining purposes, it is also, to some extent, a tourist centre and a service centre for the general area. Commonwealth Railways employees live in the township. A number of Australian and State Government Departments not connected with the Trust's mining activities, such as the Highways Department, Department for Community facilities at Leigh Creek and staff living in the town. The nearby townships of Copley and Lyndhurst and surrounding pastoral properties which would benefit from a television service have no connection with the Trust's activities.

In these circumstances it does not seem reasonable to look solely to the Electricity Trust to provide a service from which others would benefit. However, the Trust would be willing to contribute on some reasonable basis towards the installation and operating costs of a local video-tape repeater service and would be pleased to discuss the matter with the Broadcasting Control Board.
