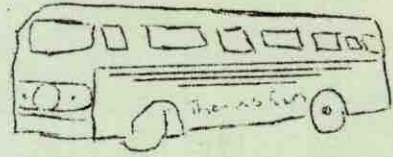
If you are interested in playing hockey socially, or learning the skills of this magnificent game then come along to this meeting, where we shall discuss times of matches, equipment etc.

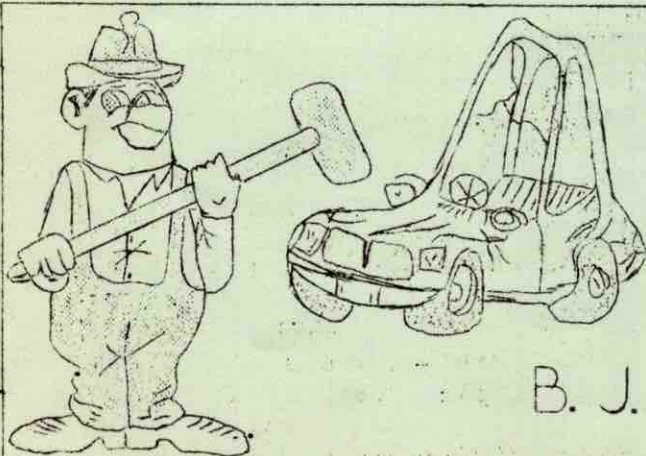

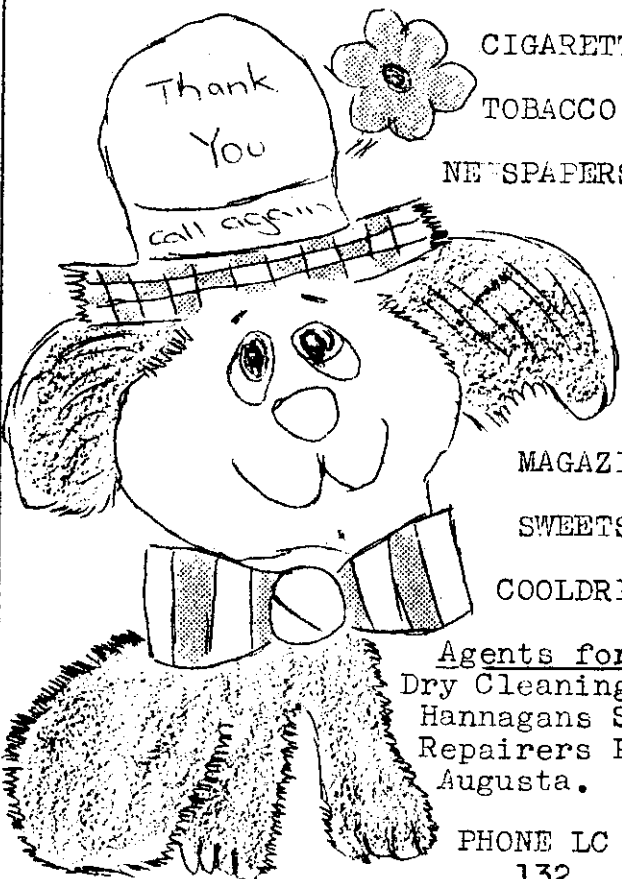

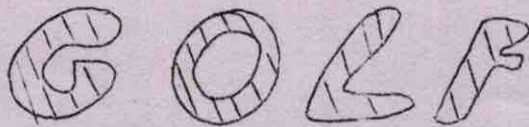
It has come to our attention that many townspeople are not aware that the Committee of the LCASC (not ETSLA) operate the pool.

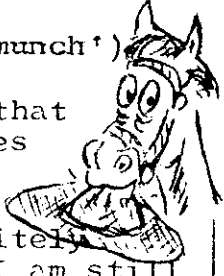

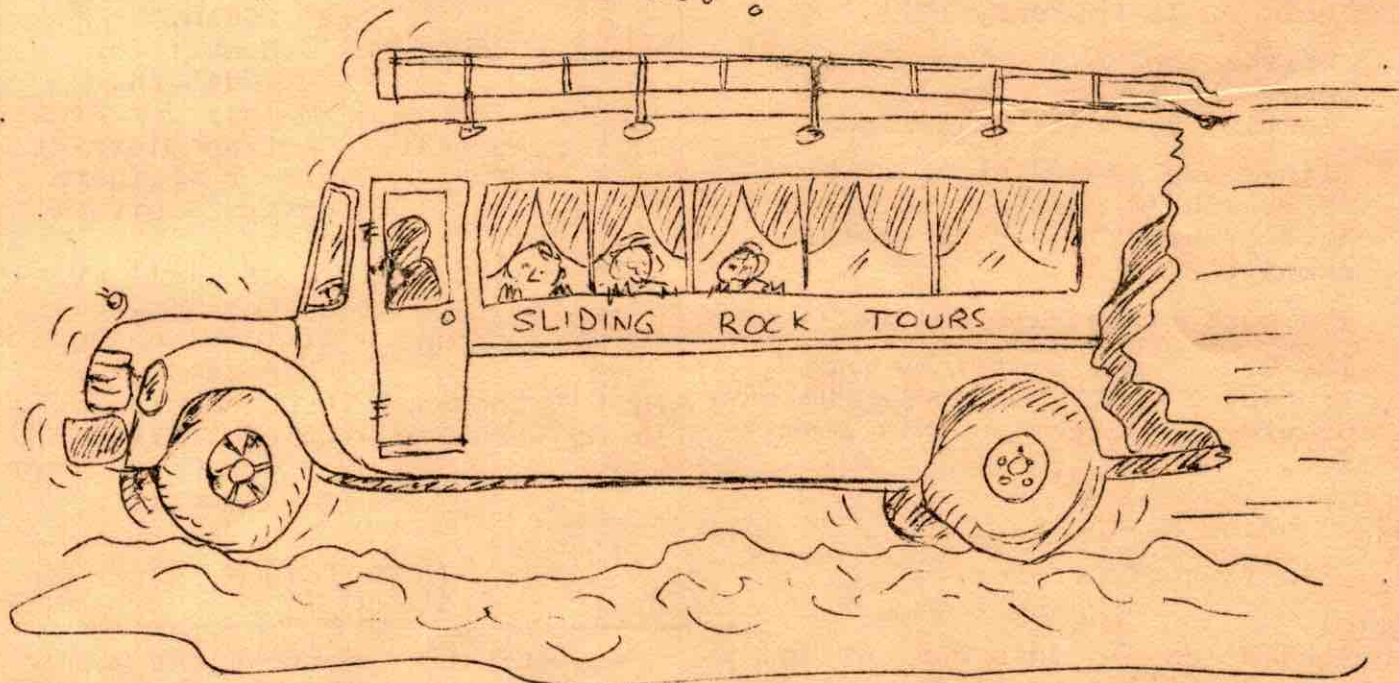

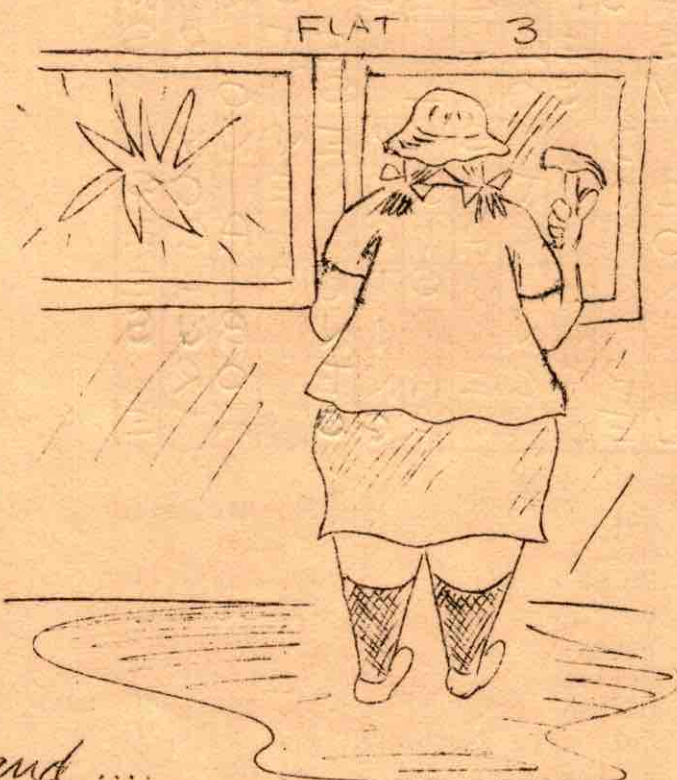
