YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT AND YOU

Unemployment among young people, i.e. those under 20, has taken on epidemic proportions in Australia, with up to 40% of the unemployed comprising of this age group. Thile in Leigh Creek, because of a stable employment base, there have been few problems so far (except perhaps among women and girls) there is no room for completency. Although you as a parent, may have a steady job, there is no guarantee that your children now will also automatically find employment, not even with the Blectricity Trust, particularly in the area of apprenticeships. Increasingly higher standards of education are demanded, particularly in the technical and physical science areas, as a pre-requisite to apprenticeship entrance.

If your child cannot meet the entry standards set by employers, his chances of getting a trade, or higher technical qualifications are remote. Both in Leigh Creek and elsewhere, as the rate of unemployment is most severe among the semiskilled and unskilled, inability to enter a trade or skilled job could well have a detrimental effect on your child's life chances, even condemn him/her to long term unemployment after leaving school:

The School Council and Staff of the Leigh Creek Area School are very concerned about this and are now preparing to set up a Physical Sciences Course, hopefully commencing next year at years 10 and 11 level, as well as developing a work experience programme for the Senior Students. The Electricity Trust is giving its support to both moves and has indicated a willingness to fully co-operate to have the course established. This cannot be done, however, until the school gets a sufficient number of enrolments (a minimum of 5) and full parental support, particularly financial, as initial Course funding will have to come from the school.

If you have a child who is to leave school within the next two years, and who could be interested in the above course, please inform the school as soon as possible.



Dear Genator Jessop,

You will recall your recent letter on behalf of Mr L L MENGERSEN, PRESIDENT of the FAR NORTHERN DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION, PO Box 50, Leigh Creek, S.A. 5731, concerning rail, road and air services in the far northern areas.

You would be aware that the Government is concerned at the losses incurred on the Central Australia Railway. In 1975 the operating loss on this line amounted to \$3.97m.

Following the severe disruption to services on the CAR early last year, ANR reviewed the services provided with a view to reducing costs whilst at the same time meeting the effective demand. The review indicated that the level of patronage on this line could be adequately handled by one train per week with extra carriages added to it as necessary. Although this service was implemented on 19 April 1976 I understand it has not yet been necessary to add additional carriages.

The Commonwealth is currently providing grants to S.A., under the Roads Grants Act 1974, to assist the State to improve its Rural Arterial roads system which includes the road from Hawker to Marree. The grant to South Australia for these roads in 1976/77 is \$3.3 million. This grant includes \$1.2 million of the additional \$3.2 million which the Commonwealth has provided to the State for roads this financial year.

The expenditure of these grants on particular road projects is recommended to me in annual programs submitted by the South Australian Minister of Transport. The State Minister takes into account the overall needs and priorities for works on various roads within the State before submitting the program and I normally accept his advice. In accordance with its Federalism policy, the Government does not duplicate functions which it sees as more appropriately belonging to the States.

The State's 1976/77 Rural Arterial roads construction program, which I approved last October, provides for 46 projects to be carried out on these roads at an estimated cost of \$6.1 million. The program is jointly funded by the Commonwealth and South Australian Governments and includes 3 projects for the Hawker to Marree road. These projects, on which an estimated \$925,000 are to be spent this year, involve the construction and sealing of a total 47 kilometres of the road between Mawker and Moralana as well as the preparation of a planning report for the Moralana to Leigh Creek section.

Under the Act, my approval of a project means that Commonwealth funds may be spent on it. The State Government is, however, responsible for deciding when projects may be commenced and the rate at which work proceeds.

If the Association feels that progress on the sealing of the road is too slow, despite the additional funds provided by the Commonwealth for the State's Rural Arterial roads this financial year, I can only suggest that it take this matter up with the South Australian Highways Department.

It will be of interest to the Association that the road grants for 1977/78, which I recently proposed to State Ministers for Transport, include \$7 million for South Australia's Rural Arterial roads. This grant is more than double that provided in 1976/77 and should enable the State to proceed more quickly with improvements to these roads.

The Association may be assured that, if the State Minister recommends further projects to seal the Hawker to Marree road in future programs submitted for my approval, its comments will be kept in mind.

As to the deterioration of air services to Leigh Creek it was unfortunately necessary for Ansett and TAA to terminate their services due to continuing poor patronage over a considerable period of time. Certainly, the airlines found that the demand was insufficient to justify the continued use of Fokker "Friendship" aircraft and were obliged for economic reasons to relinquish their services in favour of the commuter operator Pagas.

If it could be shown that demand for services by larger airline aircraft could reasonably be sustained, then I am sure that the airlines would readily restore services to Leigh Creek.

I trust that the above information will assist you in replying to Mr Mengersen.
