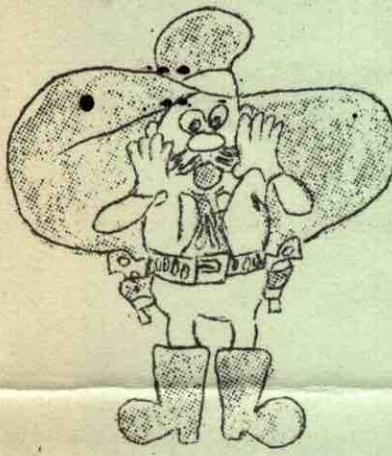

father said to the boy.



USING JUMPER LEADS FOR BATTERY BOOSTING

Applying jumper cables between two batteries may cause serious injury and also destroy a battery or damage a vehicle if not done correctly.

A. battery under charge generates hydrogen gas, which is both flammable and explosive, and a spark from a jumper cable may cause the gas to explode with serious results. However, jumper cables, when used in the proper manner, provide an efficient way of starting an engine which has a discharged battery.

IMPORTANT

Modern vehicles have the negative (-) battery terminal connected to the metal work (earth) of the vehicle. THESE INSTRUCTIONS ONLY APPLY WHEN THE NEGATIVE IS EARTHED IN BOTH CASES.

Jumper Cables Should Be Installed This Way: -

- 1) Check the voltage and earth polarity of both batteries and be sure they are the same.
- 2) Remove battery vent caps or covers and cover both batteries with a piece of cloth.
- 3) Attach one jumper from positive (+) of the charged battery to the positive (+) of the discharged battery.
- 4) Attach one jumper from negative (-) of the charged battery to a part of the engine at least 12 inches away from the discharged battery and clear of the carburettor.
- 5) When removing the jumper leads reverse the above sequence exactly.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Do NOT lean over either battery when making connections.

Wear Safety Glasses.

Prevent clamps from touching each other.

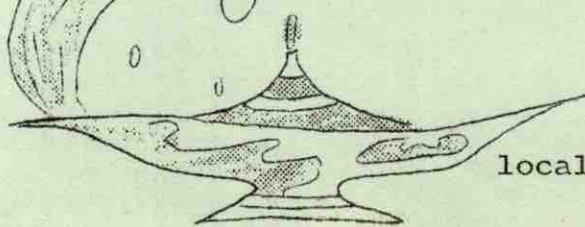
