If you have experience in any type of youth work (gymnastics, athletics etc.), then we need your services. If you are prepared to help just supervise children, then we need you.

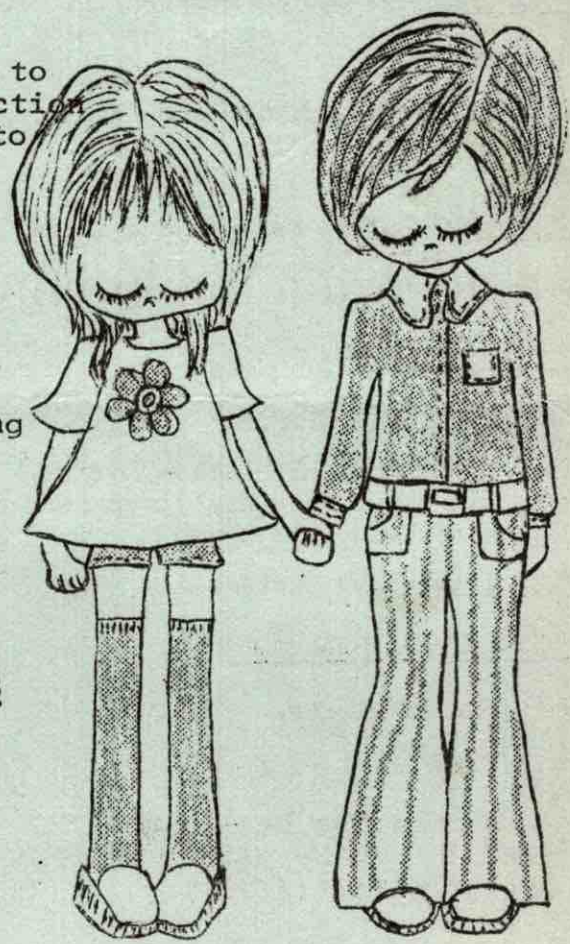
