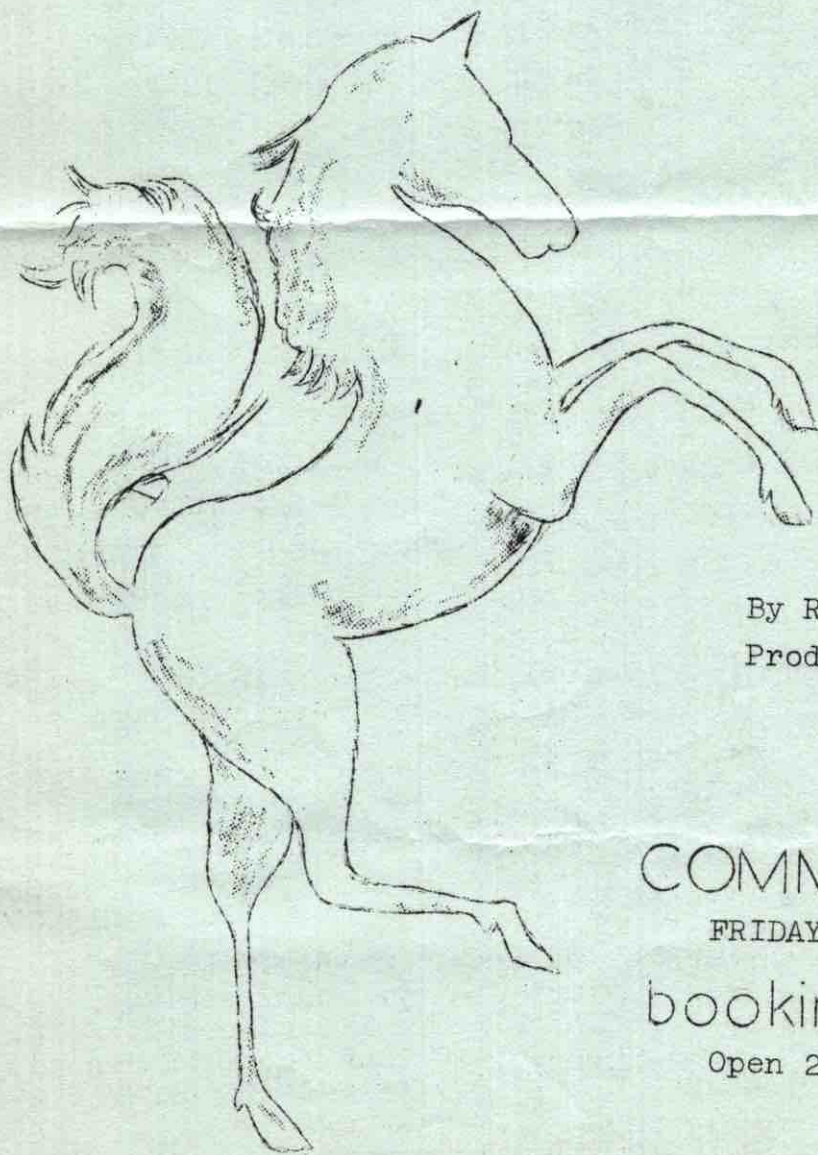

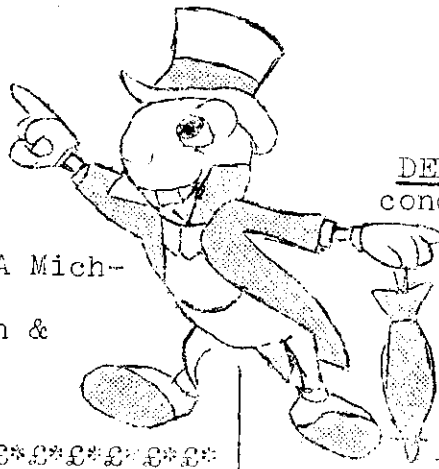

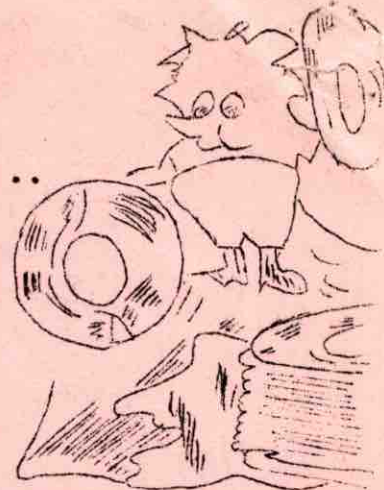

Subscribers are informed that a new ruling has been made regarding the initial deposit paid on joining the library.

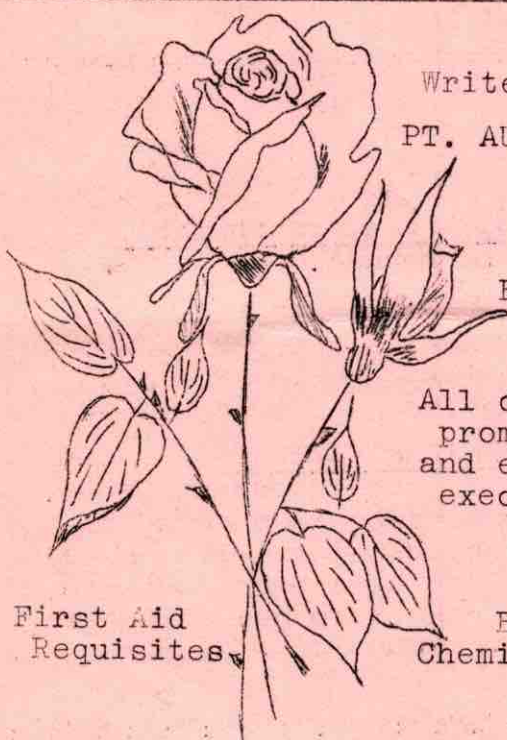
In the past, this deposit of \$1.50 has been made to cover any loss of books, and has been held in trust, to be refundable on request.

1. The distance covered by the players in the men's game far exceeds that covered by the ladies.
2. Because men are allowed the freedom of movement, they run further & faster to evade & outplay their opponent, & finally reach the goal-front. The defenders also have to run quickly & organise their zone defence (if Windbag knows what this means).

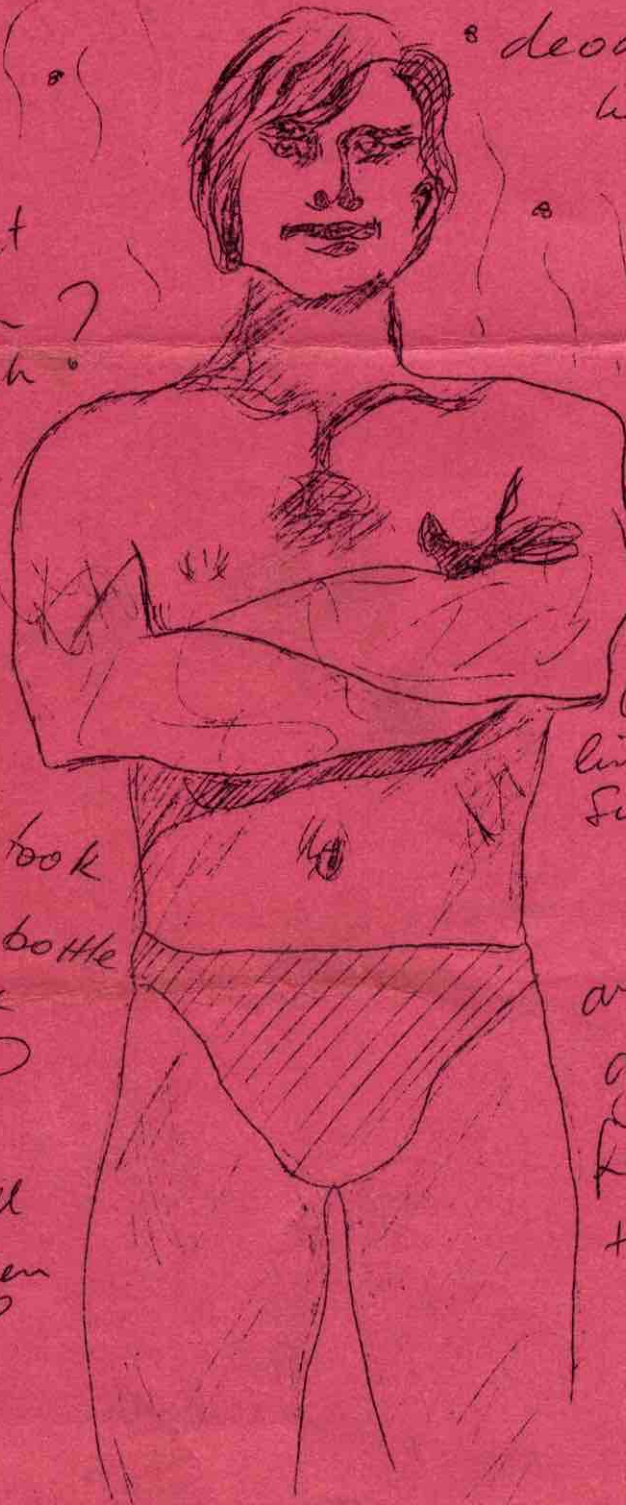
