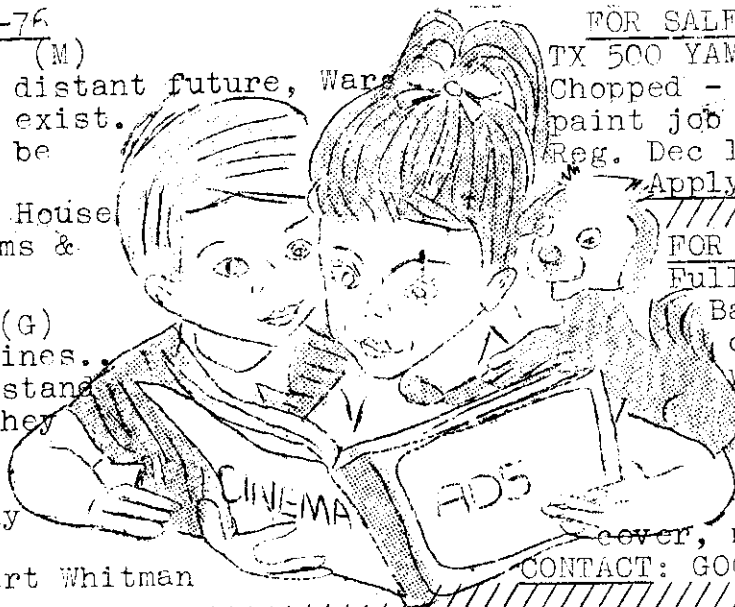

GREEN THUMB reports

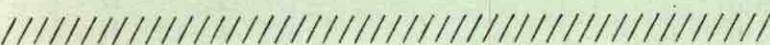
Plants to look at

Leigh Creek has a variety of flowing native plants of special interest to plant lovers.

Several are in flower now and worth a look at. This week, take a look at a glorious Hakea Lourina, the pincussion Hakea in the front lawn of 13 Second Street. This is a favourite among many native plant growers and has glorious round red flowers. A good bush for gardens at Leigh Creek.

The big yellow flowers that have been out for sometime on the grey coloured drooping gums around town belong to Eucalyptus Woodwardi. This is a W.A. plant from the goldfields. Many fine examples may be seen, an especially good one is in full bloom now on the street outside No 11, Second Street, right next door to the pincussion Hakea.

Take a look at the Lindsay gums (Eucalyptus Erythronema), opposite the Community Hall in the school yard. Just through the gate on the left is a small white barked tree carrying masses of red bloom. Two trees further down is a white form of the same species.

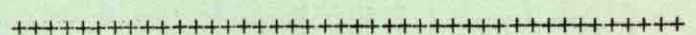

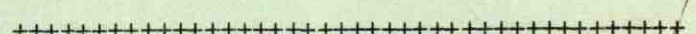

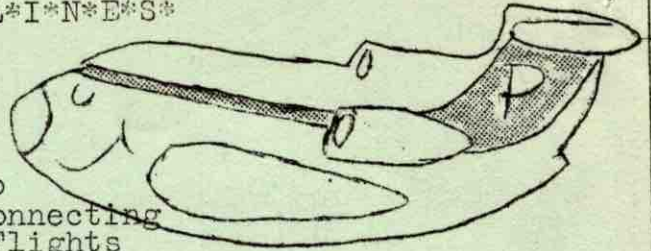

*COMMUNITY AFFAIRS CORNER - "CARE TO SHARE"***

DID YOU KNOW THAT the Department for Social Security can assist parents or guardians, of severely physically or mentally handicapped children under the age of 16 years, living in the family home, who need constant care and attention. It does so by paying them a special HANDICAPPED CHILDRENS ALLOWANCE. This is intended to supplement child endowment and help with the Education, Training, Transportation and General Welfare of handicapped children. The allowance is not subject to the means test and is not treated as income in assessing other Social Security Benefits. Parents who have had to struggle with the care of such a child, know just how expensive this can be, with extra trips to Adelaide, a large medical and chemist bill and so many extra costs building up.

DID YOU ALSO KNOW that the same Department can be of assistance to you, if you lose pay when you are off work because of illness or because of an accident. It may be paid after 7 days off work, but payment depends on a means test. Thus other money you may have had coming in prior to or during the sickness e.g. holiday pay, long service leave pay, may affect the amount you are paid. Any person between 16 and 65 can claim the benefit. However, a married woman, who is supported by her husband while she is off work, misses out.

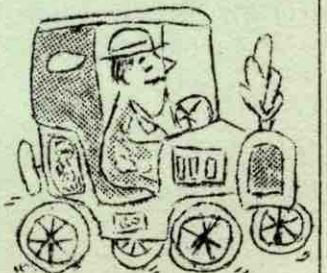

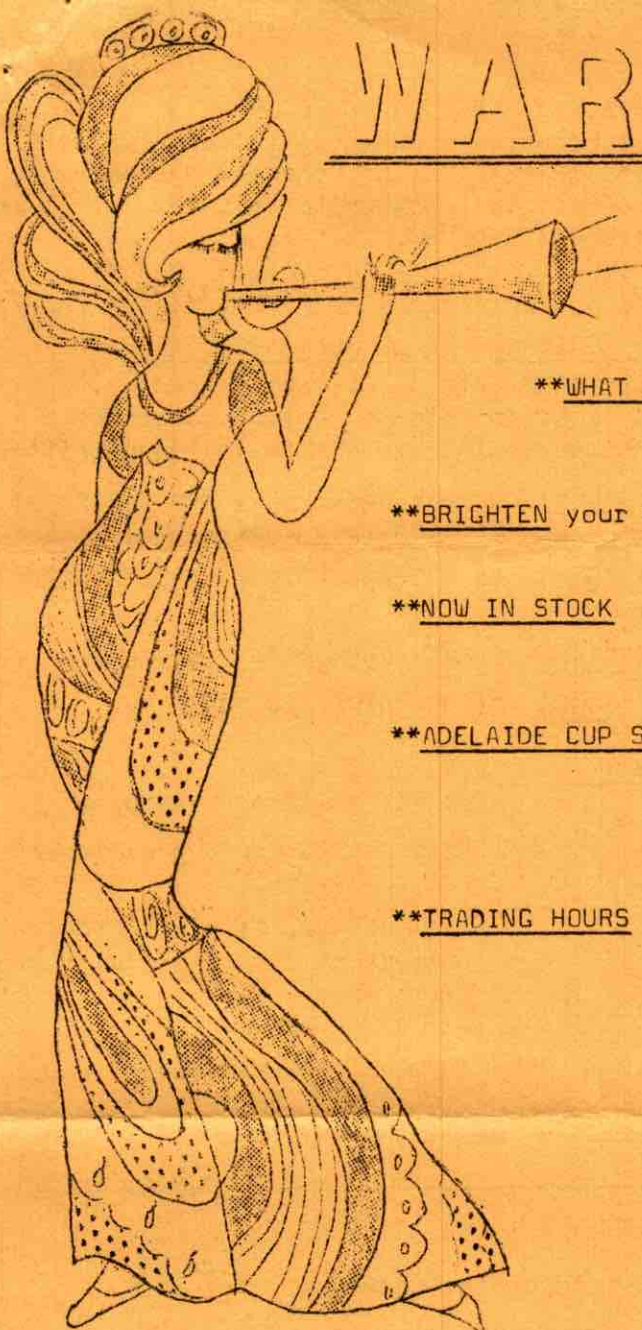

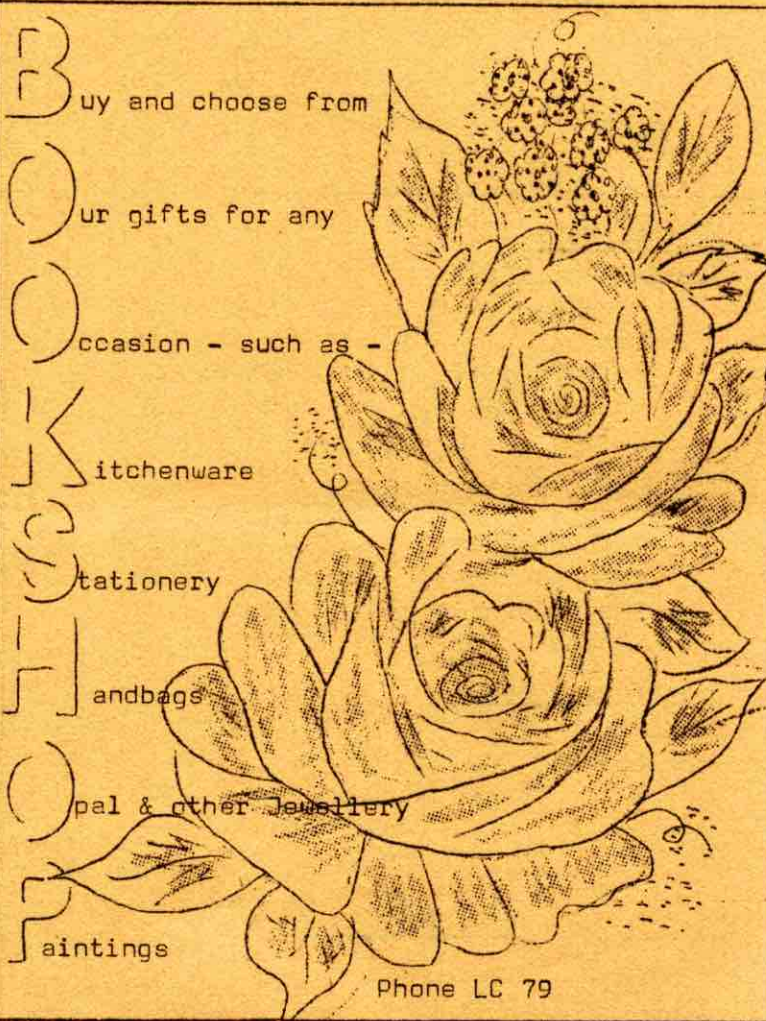
***** COMMUNITY SELF HELP - THE FIRST STEP *****

A fortnight ago, a meeting was held in the Copley town hall among Aboriginal people from the Nepabunna, Copley, Beltana and LC area. The reason for this meeting was to find out what the general problems were which affected the Aboriginal people in the region.

It had been prompted by developments towards self help in other regions such as Pt Augusta, where Aboriginals got together as a small group of people, who were interested in looking at problems and issues from an overall community viewpoint. From these meetings grew the concept of ASSESSMENT TEAMS, which then collected information about the size of specific problems raised, such as housing or unemployment and proposed alternative ways of dealing with these problems. At the same time, such a team would hold regular meetings to ensure that local knowledge and opinions could be matched with the information obtained. It would also seek advice from outside resource people, such as professionals, Government Departments and the like. It therefore would seek to successfully blend advice from all kinds of people both from within and from outside the region.

Problems raised at the Copley meeting ranged from unemployment at Nepabunna, to the lack of rubbish collecting facilities at Copley, from difficulties created through overuse of alcohol to lack of medical transport for the area.

From the meeting a small working group of 6 people, representing the respective communities, formed and they had their first meeting this week. The group tentatively called the Northern Flinders Aboriginal Community Group, intends

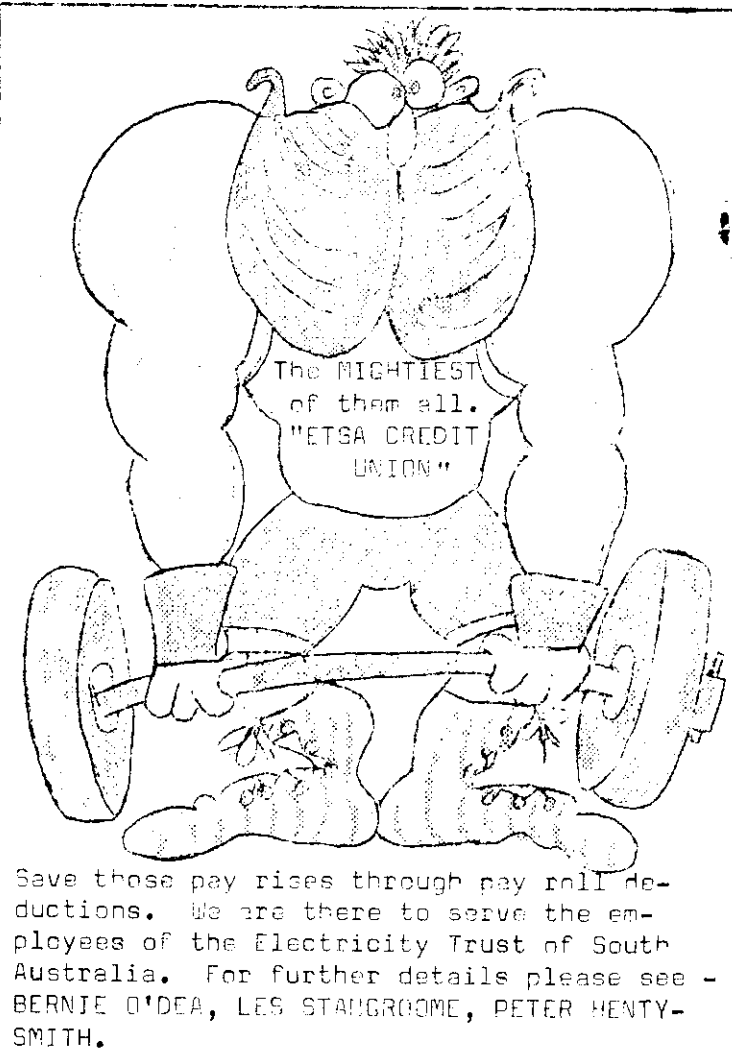

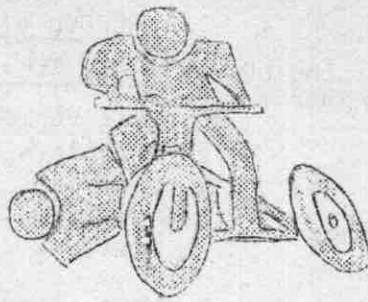

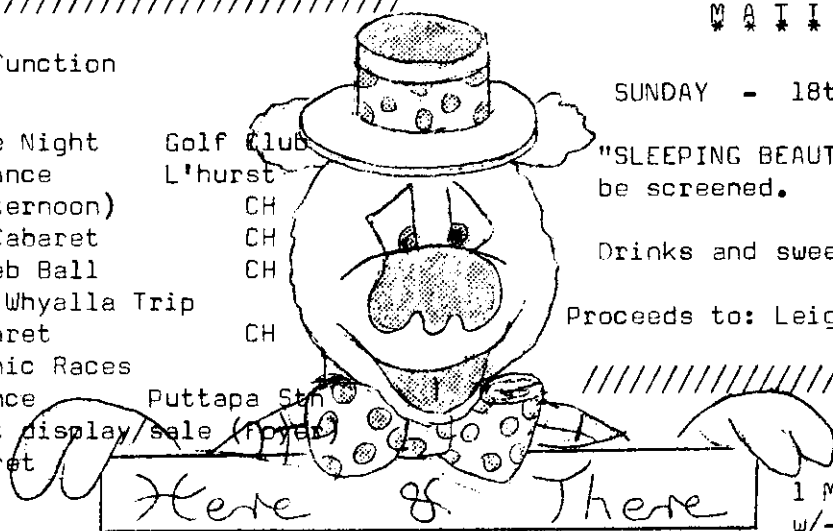

FREE SERVICE

TRACHOMA, sometimes known as "Sandy Blight" is a chronic infection of the front of the eyeball and the lining of the eye-lids. It is a significant cause of blindness and of extreme visual discomfort among people living in dry, sunny areas of Australia.

As well as being concerned with setting up a programme to tackle Trachoma, the Health Team will offer a general eyecare service.

The examination does not take more than a couple of minutes and is quite painless. Glasses will be prescribed for those who need them; and for those who have been badly affected by repeated attacks of Trachoma, Professor Hollows and his team will be able to help them by carrying out corrective surgery to the eyelids in the Clinic.

A CLINIC WILL BE HELD at the LEIGH CREEK HOSPITAL DENTAL CLINIC on TUESDAY, 6th July, day and night commencing at 9.00am. - 8.00pm. Wednesday, 7th from 9.00am - 11.00am.

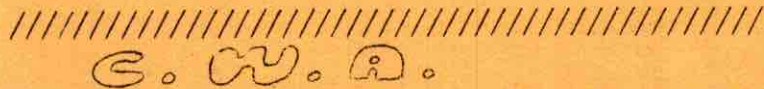

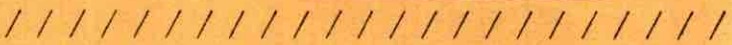
G O L F A S S O C I A T E S

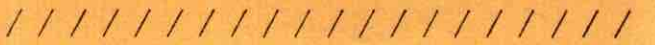

PEPPERMINT ICING

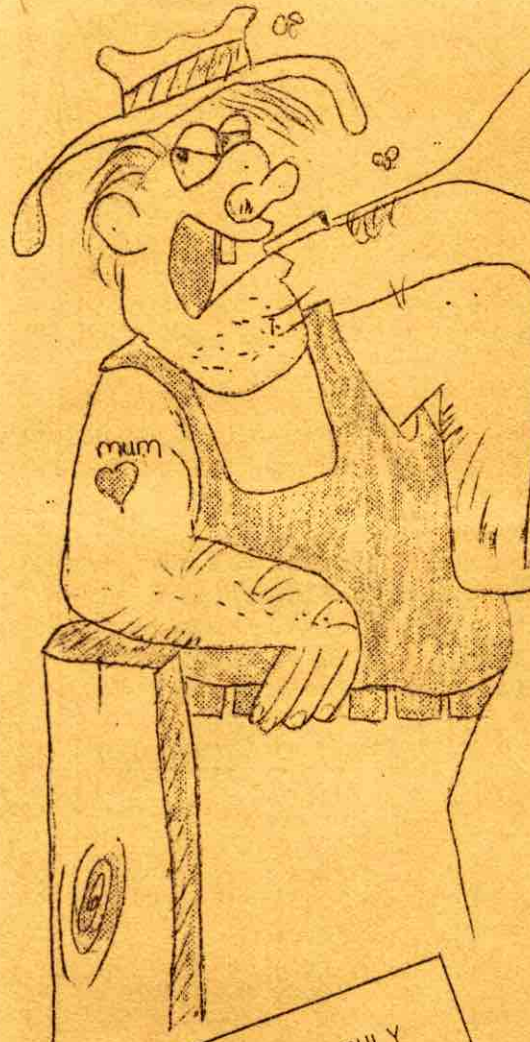
12 oz Icing Sugar, 2 oz Copha
