"LEIGH CREEK SOON ON AIR" (Ad. Ju. 19)

A new national broadcasting station,
 5LC, at Leigh Creek, is scheduled to
 begin regular transmissions on June
 30th. The Postmaster-General (Sir
 Alan Hulme) told Mr. Kelly, MHR,
 yesterday that the station was under-
 going final tests. The station will
 operate on a frequency of 1,570
 kilocycles with a power of 50 watts.
 Mr. Kelly said that because of the
 distance from existing broadcasting
 stations, reception at Leigh Creek
 was poor. The nearest high-power
 national broadcasting station was
 5CK Crystal Brook some 200 miles
 away. The Leigh Creek station was
 being established in accordance with
 plans developed by the Australian
 Broadcasting Control Board to provide
 adequate broadcasting reception over
 as wide an area as was economically
 practicable. Leigh Creek listeners
 would receive a high grade reception
 of national programmes on relay from
 Adelaide."



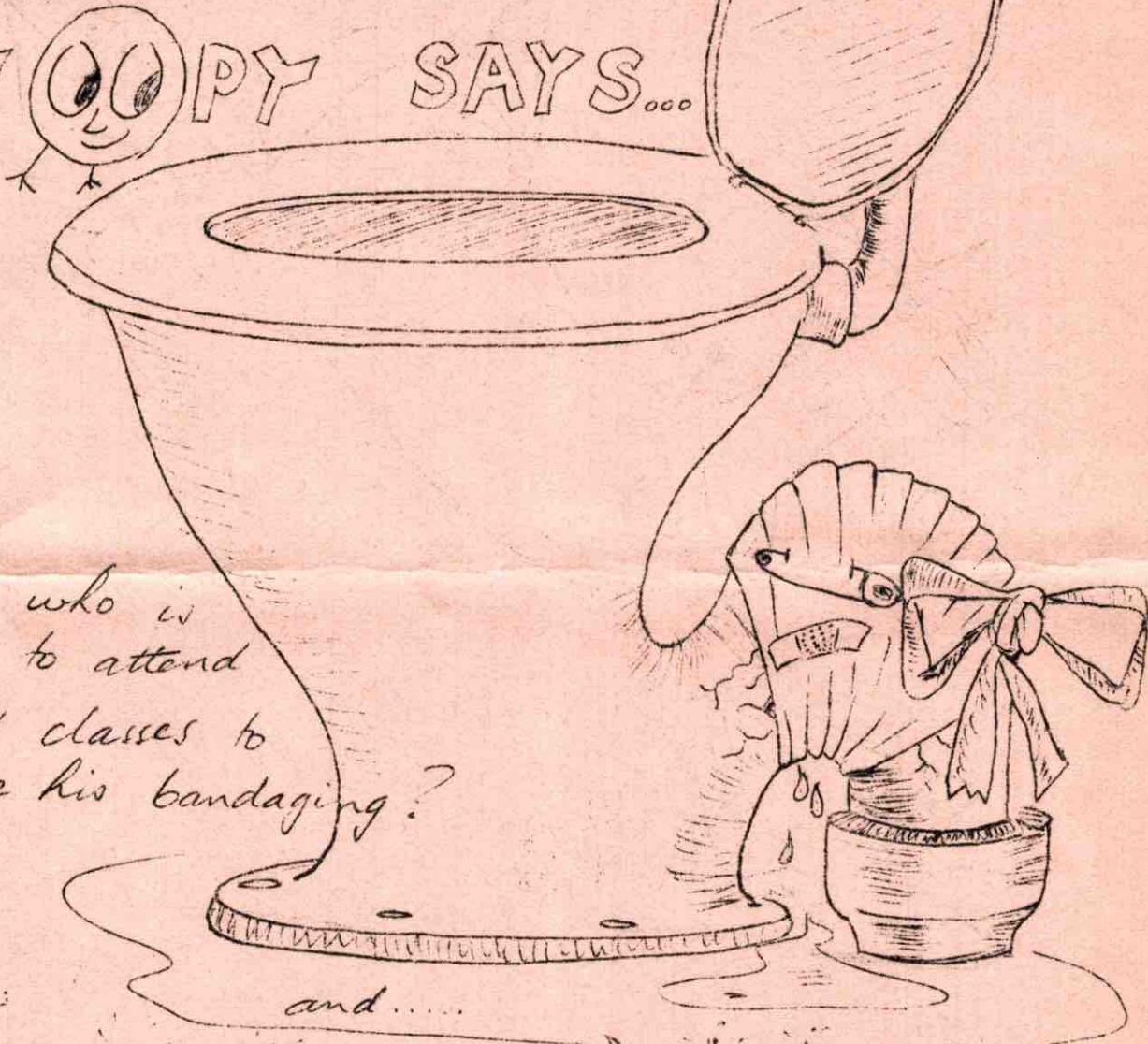

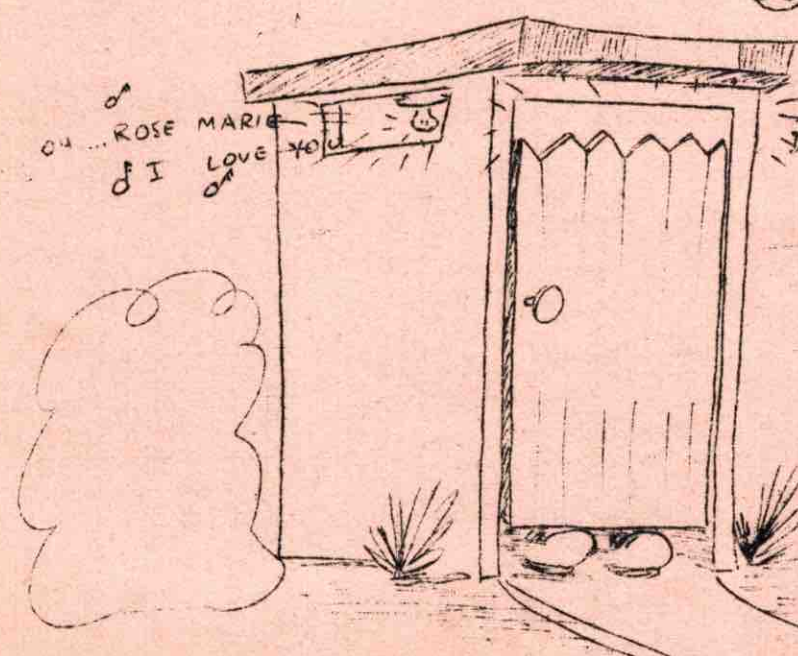
