People helping neople in Youth, Aged, Ethnic and Welfare Organisations are invited to apply for grants from the -

COMMUNITY WELFARE GRANTS

to assist in short term and other projects involving payment for the erection of buildings, hire or purchase of equipment or payment of salaries.

Last year, Grants of up to \$5,000 for buildings and equipment and up to \$10,000 were approved to enable organisations like Youth Clubs, Playgroups, Community Recreation Centres, Service Clubs, Youth Drop In Centres, Self Help Croups, Activities Clubs, Scout Groups, Community Organisations with religious affiliations (e.g. Church Clubs), Volunteer Groups, Womens Groups and other bodies to employ part time or full time staff where necessary.

Grants may be made towards the following:-

- Equipment for Community or Youth activities (up to \$750).
- 2. Erection of new buildings (up to \$7,500).
- 3. Improvements to existing buildings (up to \$3.000).
- appointment of persons investigating needs or pioneering new programmes.
- Appointment of professional or organisational staff.

Generally, these Grants are made to self help voluntary groups in the community towards the provision of suitable facilities and ervices for the promotion of community welfare and the well being of families and individuals, and for the prevention of social problems.

Applications for Major Grants (those over \$300) should be lodged by 1/8/77. There is no time limit on applications for Minor Grants (up to \$300).






GREEN THUMB REPORTS




