The Hon. C R Kelly MP, Sen. D S Jessop, Hon A M Whyte MP and Mr Claude Allen MP arranged a special charter flight last Friday to attend the Annual meeting of the Far Northern Development Assoc.

Sen. Jessop indicated that this energetic Association was most helpful to Federal and State MPs' and particularly in providing continuing information concerning the problems of the northern part of Sth. Aust.

Mr Kelly has written to the Minister for Civil Aviation expressing concern at the air services to Leigh Creek and asking that urgent consideration be given to providing a daily service to that area by a third level air line operator.

Sen. Jessop said that he has lent Mr Kelly his full support in this particular matter.
