
SUPPER ROOM COMMITTEE



Most people take for granted that the cups, saucers, plates etc., that are produced at functions, belong to the Trust, and are available when and where required. Actually, the majority of items are the property of the "Supper Room Committee".

The equipment is available to all financial members (Clubs, organizations etc) who have paid the joining fee of \$5.00, and the range of gear available includes: — cups, saucers, bread & butter plates, entree plates, dinner plates, soup bowls, sweets dishes, sugar basins, jugs, trays, tea spoons, bridge tables and cloths, tea pot and a 4 gallon boiling water urn.
