"AIR AMBULANCE REPORT

In the 10 years that aircraft have been used for patient movement in St<sup>h</sup> Aust., a steady growth has been maintained; however, in 1975 the growth became more rapid, mainly because of the extension of the service into areas previously serviced by road ambulances and the use made by Medical Retrieval Teams from the major hospitals.

Patients moved totalled 690, a 22% increase on the previous year and because of this increase, a third aircraft was purchased and a fourth pilot employed."

Following a motor vehicle accident near Beltana in 1974 in which the Ambulance Crew were seriously injured, Privates R DOCKING and C MUNDY were awarded Meritorious Certificates by the Chief Commissioner for their outstanding devotion to duty. 
We also played the 3rd round of the International Bowl and the Silver Spoon which were won by Mrs L DORTON with a Net 91.

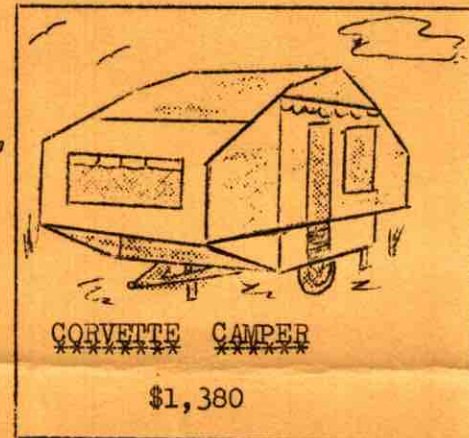

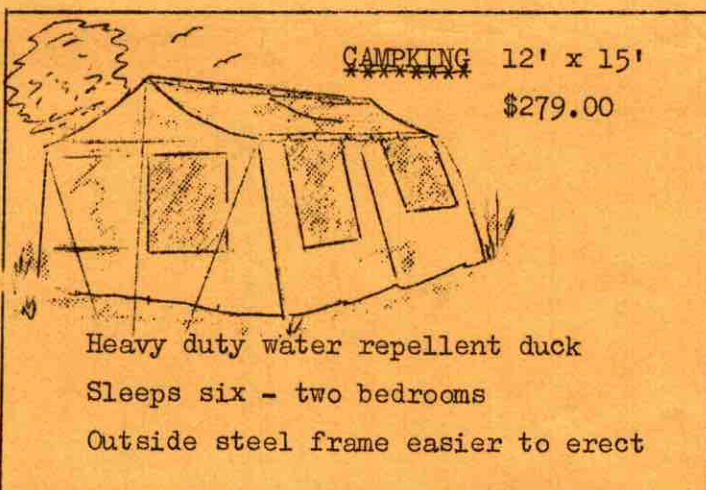

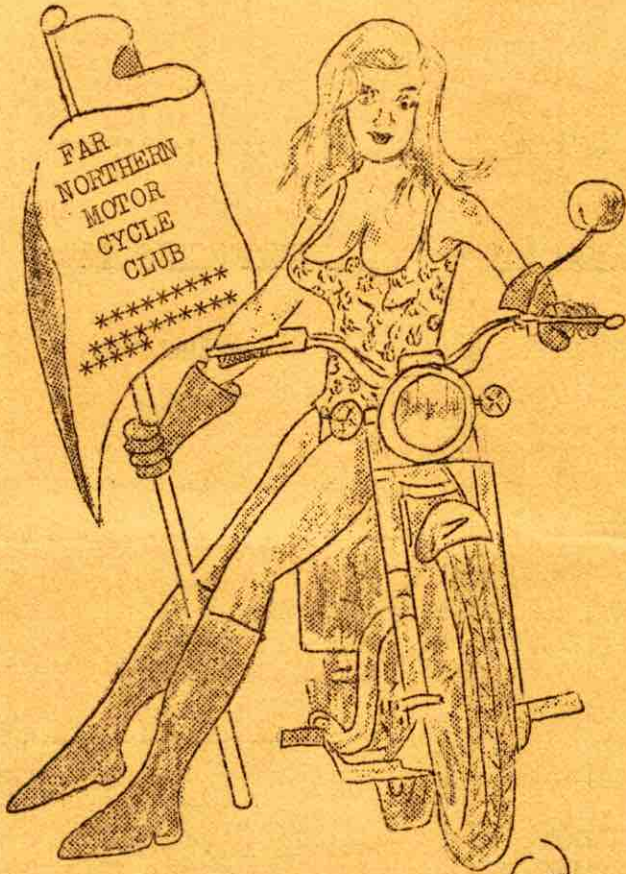
