

SWITZERLAND

Trouble spots in the Middle East and other areas around the world ceased and for a few hours there was total peace. President Nixon USA., and Prime Minister Wilson UK, were among the first to arrive at Geneva. The heads of Russia, Tonga and Luchestein were among the last to arrive 20 minutes later. The Australian PM was conspicuous by his absence, although he did arrive at the conference hall 17 hours after the world leaders had returned to their respective countries. It was later reported that the PM's new white Holden had a puncture near Monte Carlo.

In view of the emergency, the rest of the world went ahead with their plans to answer the distress signal sent out from Leigh Creek at 0900 hrs on Friday, 14 June. The Australian flag was flown upside-down outside a prominent building, (A flag flown in such a manner is Internationally recognised as a distress signal.) It was generally assumed that the FM's non arrival at the conference indicated that he was himself at the scene of the disaster and directing rescue operations.

The Chairman of the conference, the King of Rorotonga (Cook Islands) did not know the exact location of Leigh Creek and only vaguely where Australia was situated. He decided to send all the worlds' available shipping, both Mercantile and Naval, to the disaster.
