
Dear Mrs Rappold.

Consequent to discussions whilst Mr Thomas and I were in Leigh Creek recently, we have looked closely into means of providing a service from the north on long weekends or any time required.

We are quite happy to provide such a service so long as it is economical to do so. To achieve this it appears that we could go about it in one of two ways.

- (A) By far the simplest from our viewpoint would be for some interested local person or club to charter the coach from us at a figure of \$580.00. It would then be up to them to interest enough people to travel naturally the more that travelled the cheaper per head it becomes. We could obtain a special Permit from the Transport Control Board for such a movement.
- (B) The other way would be for us to have our licence varied to depart Leigh Creek on Friday and Adelaide on Monday. This would mean that we would need to charge normal return fares and be assured of a minimum of 30 adult passengers. It would be essential that intending passengers book early with our agent so that we could assess the potential. Final ticketing would be required 14 days prior to travel required 14 days prior to travel.

In both cases we would suggest a 9.00pm departure from either end with an arrival time of 6.00am the following morning. However, if the local people would prefer an earlier departure on Friday night to arrive early hours of Saturday, that could be arranged.



#### ISOLATED CHILDREN PARENT ASSOC.

A recent announcement by the Commonwealth Dept. of Education has clarified the position of children doing Correspondence School lessons under the "Assistance for Isolated Childrens" plan.

The allowance of up to \$350 will be split into two parts. The first basic payment of \$200 per annum will be made as a matter of right to any child whose parent fills in claim form SS 101. A further \$150 per child may be claimed for additional expenses such as:-

(a) Governess or home help

(b) Hire of transceivers

(c) Approved accomodation (but not travel) costs.


# \*CHRISTMAS TREE CLUB\*
