



he above rates are the maxima, but cheaper rates are available when a road utilisation is made of the airaraft, that is in excess of three hours per day. The aircraft is equipped and licensed for night flight but is not available for general charter at night. However, it is available for energencies, i.e. ambulance functions at night. 


