LEIGH CREEK XMAS TREE CLUB



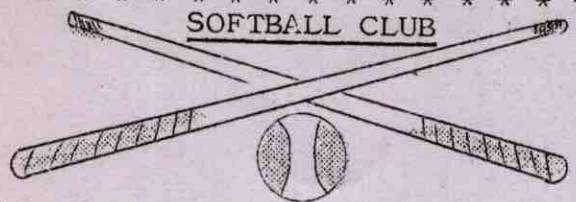
The Xmas Tree party will be held this year on SATURDAY, 7 December.

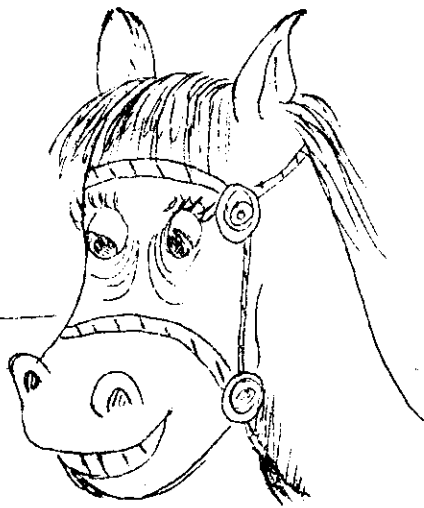
