STATE CONCESSION CARDS

The State Government has introduced a "STATE CONCESSION CARD SCHEME"

The scheme has the specific aim of providing concessions from State Government Department and other Authorities to people who meet the Department for Social Security's income criteria for the Pensioners Health Benefit (P.H.B) card, but who, for various reasons, are not entitled to a P.H.B. card.

Mainly these people include:

- People over 60 years of age (including migrants).
- Single supporting parents male and female, who have the Financial responsibility and day to day care of a child or children (subject to contain income restrictions).
- 3) A war widow, a war widowed mother.

Concessions are available from Departments and Authorities such as:-

HOUSING:

Rent rebates from the Housing Trust.

HEALTH:

A range of special concessions from State Government Health Service e.g. transport, dental treatment, free spectacles etc.

TRANSPORT:

A variety of Concessions for travel on Trains, Buses and Trams.

LEGAL AID:

Through the Legal Assistance Scheme as the Legal Adviser Service.

RATES & TAXES:

Remission of up to 60%

It is expected that the Department for Social Security will shortly cease to issue Concession Cards to those Supporting Mothers who are granted a Supporting Mothers Benefit. Those (cont..

who are already in possession of a Concession Card from D.S.S. will be required to surrender their card, but, can apply for a State Concession Card.



GREEN THUMB PREPARES FOR THE NEW LEIGH CREEK

The new Leigh Creek will need lots of gardening in the early stages to create an environment pleasant to live in.

Many plants may be shifted to the new site, especially small fruit trees, vines and roses. In order to make the shift easier and increase the chances of success, a couple of root prunings in the next two winters are recommended.

Root pruning is done by forcing a sharp spade into the soil in a circle around the plant. The distance back from the plant depends on the plant, but make it not further than the line of the canopy of the tree.

When you root prune, be sure to prune the top as well, in order to keep a good balance between the top and bottom. Failure to prune the top may result in the plant wilting severely in summer. The ratio between roots and leaf is very important.

Root pruning chops the roots back and encourages a ball of roots close to the stem. This makes transplanting much easier in a year or two.

It is also a good practice to water by a dripper or slow trickle close to the plant for the next year, to encourage a confined root growth.

Repeat the process next winter.

Start NOW to plan your gardening for the new town. Good planning and use of correct plants, well suited to this area, can produce a nice to look at, and low maintenance garden.

Use of water will become more and more important with time, so we should design our gardens using plants requiring the minimum of water. This way, we can better afford to heavily water the small parts of our gardens where water is essential e.g. the vegetable patch and the lawn area.

Take note of plants around the town that appeal to you, and appear to do well in dry places. Right now have a look at the small wattle bush in the school yard opposite the Kindy. This is called Acacia Notablis, and is a local plant, growing naturally in the Flinders Ranges. Very low requirements of water make it a valuable plant to consider. It has a lovely perfume and its abundance of flowers make it a plant of great value. It's in flower now. Take note and keep it in mind.
