Because of the climate experienced in this region, lawns trees and shrubs are the main features which should be developed. The former, preferably in uncroken sweeps, (or if colour is wanted in the form of a single bed) not in small irregular beds and shade is essential especially on Northern & Western sides of the house & also for the outdoor living area. Several gardens of good standard lost points last year because of lack of trees. It is ple sing to note that very few gardens now lack lawns and the use of large standard of lawns.

has almost ceased. Rock or brick edged beds can be attractive providing they are not used to excess or painted. Further, the former are often most difficult to keep free from couch grass and weeds. To gain worth while points for outdoor living a distinctive area is called for. This should include a barbeque, table, chairs of provision for these, lawn and shade trees.

In developing gardens where lawn is extensively planted, make sure that newly planted trees (or shrubs) have a lawn free area of at least 12 to 15 inches around them. Unless this is done the grass will have a generally retarding and dwarfing effect on young trees.
