





PRESIDENTS NOTE





Jim has left a legacy of friends and articles (per 'Topics') at Leigh Creek and below is his last letter to his LC buddies written in the true Dingwall style.

"Dear Ron and all my other alcoholic mates of the Round Table,

This near-Utopian existence in Pensioner's Paradise is not all it's cracked up to be ... I DON'T KNOW WHAT TO DO WITH MYSELF ALL DAY.

Take for instance my daily routine.
(I nearly said drudge). I get up every morning promptly at ten-o-clock. This I think must be by force of habit protracted from my years in Leigh Creek when Rufus used to rouse me from my work with a cup of tea at 10.am five days a week. After a cup of black coffee, laced with a little brandy as an eye-opener (in a house as small & compact as mine, it would be dangerous to walk about with one's eyes closed), the busiest part of my day begins. 

Minister for the Media - CANBERRA 13 July 1973

Dear Mr Lucas, (Secretary, LC Combined Union Council)

I refer to your letter concerning television in relation to Leigh Creek. This reply will also serve as a reply to your letter addressed to the Frime Minister, the Hon. E G Whitlam, Q.C., on the same subject, which was passed to me for attention.

At the outset, I should say that both the Government and the Australian Broadcasting Control Board, which is the authority responsible for the planning and development of the television services, are fully appreciative of the desire of country people to have the amenity of television "available to them. However, as I explained in my letter on this matter to the South Australian Premier, the Hon. D A Dunstan, who made representations on behalf of your Council there are both technical and economic difficulties associated with the provision of television services to relatively remote and sparsely populated areas such as Leigh Creek.

I find that there is little that I am able to add to the information I conveyed in my earlier letter in regard to the costs which would be involved in establishing a television station at Leigh Creek, compared with the costs of the stations in the seventh stage of television development, which include the Queensland stations to which you referred in your letter.

You will no doubt be aware that in my reply to Mr Dunstan, a copy of which I provided to Senator Willesee who also made representations on your behalf, I explained that the only possibility of television being made available to Leigh Creek in the near future appeared to be in the provision of a second-class television service by the establishment of a video-tape "repeater station", and that the suggestion had been put to various local organisations at Leigh Creek that such a service could be arranged, provide the necessary funds to finance the establishment and operation of such a station.

On the question of the possibility of the Electricity Trust participating in such a scheme, to which you made reference in your letter addressed to the Prime Minister, it is not known if any interested party has yet made an approach on the matter to the Trust.

I am sorry that I am unable to provide you with a more hopeful reply. However, I should point out that it is my intention that a continuing programme of works to improve television services will be maintained by the Broadcasting Control Board, within the limits of the finances and other resources available to the Government, and the Chairman of the Board has assured me that the representations of your Council and the points you have made will be kept in mind in this regard.
