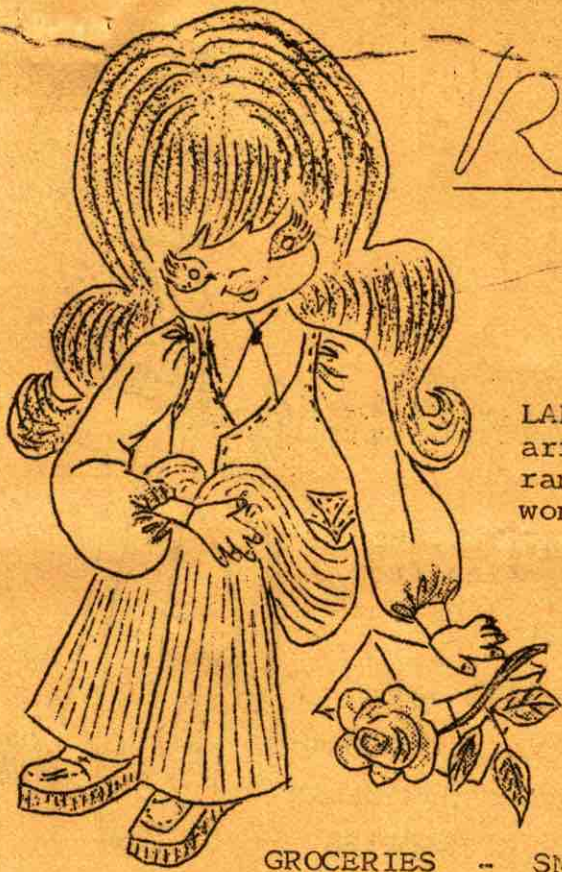
The azure sky, tinged with a suspicion of Spring, was a fitting venue for the 21 players who meandered thither and hither at the behest of their capricious ball.
