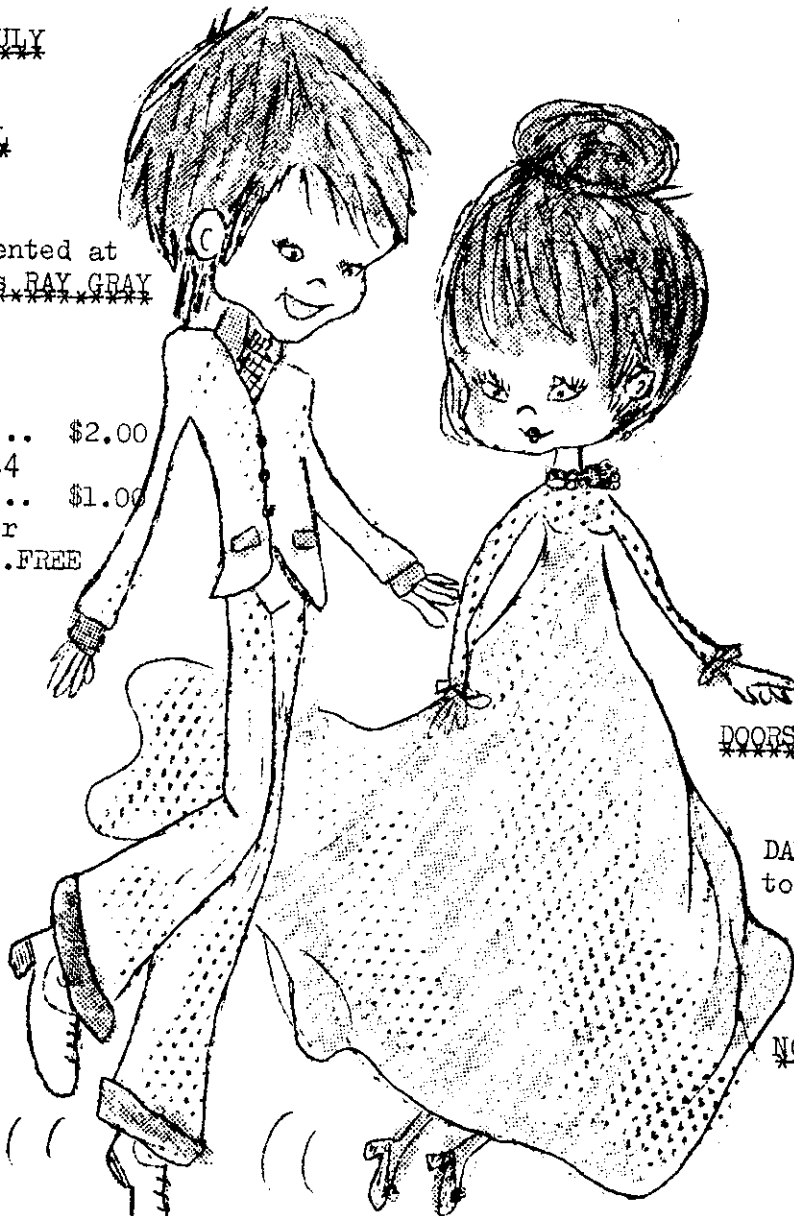

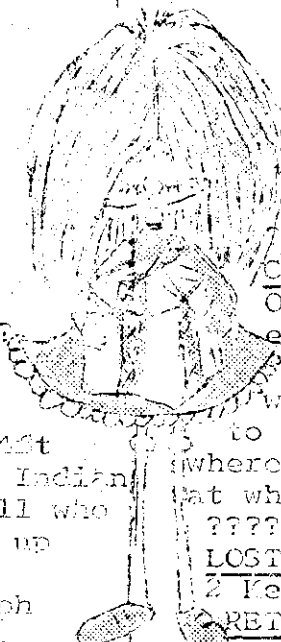

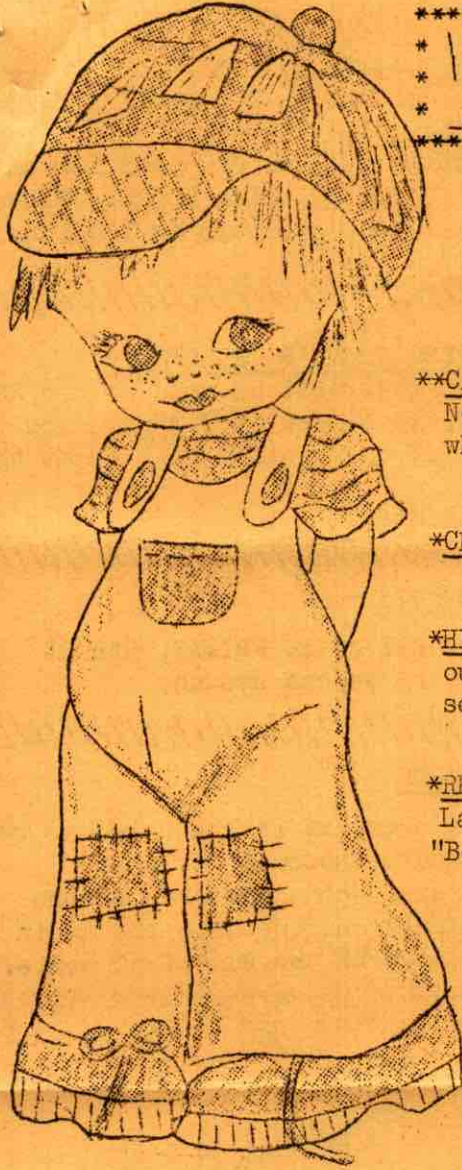

Over the next few issues of 'Topics' we will be talking about cookery and nutrition as well as printing a list of the Nutritive substances, protein, fat, carbohydrates, calories and vitamins contained in the major foodstuffs. Our thanks to Mr BOB POCKLINGTON who has prepared this article for us.

COOKERY AND NUTRITION

It is not enough to prepare tasty dishes. Their nutritive value must also be properly balanced. Our health is largely dependent on the proper nutritive value of our food, and it is therefore very important to know its nutritional contents.

Our food is divided into carbohydrates, protein, fat, mineral substances and water. In addition to these substances our food must also contain others known as vitamins, which effect the metabolism. They are only present in minute quantities but their effect is vital.

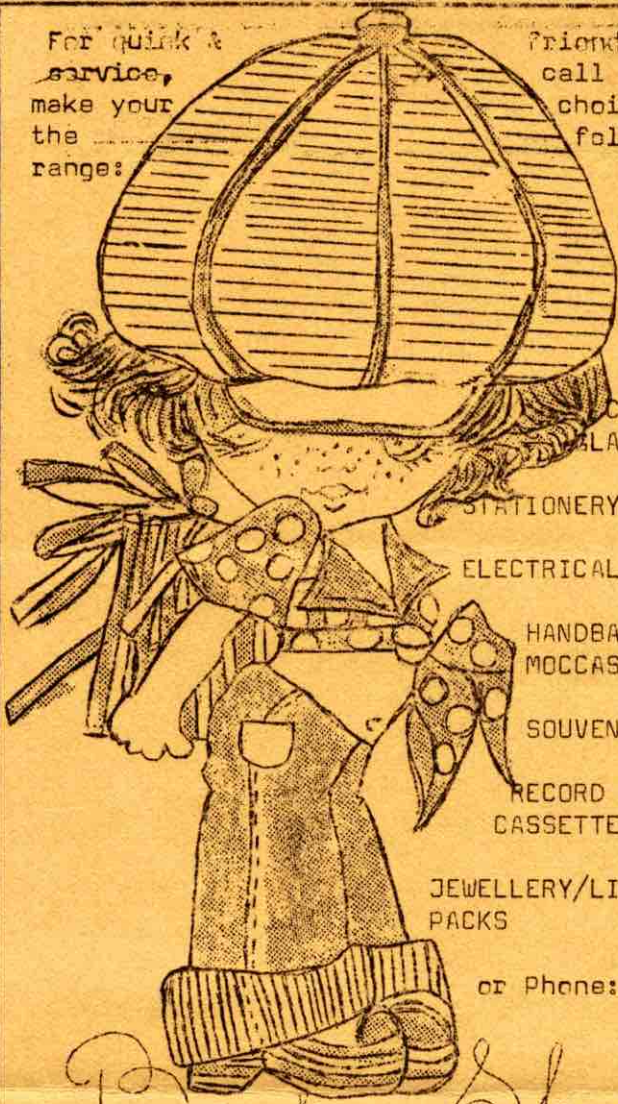
In order to maintain its energy the body needs a certain amount of food whose values we express in calories - units of heat. One cannot live on calories alone; the value of our food is determined by the proper ratio of protein, carbohydrates, fat, mineral substances and vitamins. Calories are needed, firstly to maintain vital functions, secondly in order to keep the body temperature constant, thirdly for physical and mental work and fourthly for digesting food and the resorption of the food from the intestines by the body.

For practical purposes it is enough to know that the basic quantity i.e. the amount of food needed by a normal person completely at rest, is 1,700 calories per day, and on top of this we use a certain number of calories which are dependent on body weight, hours and type of work.

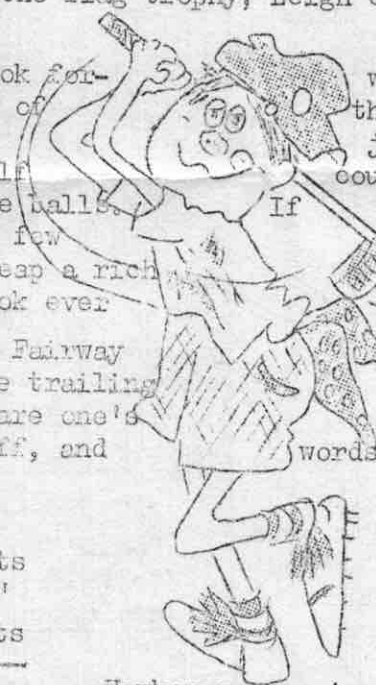
SUNDAY 18th July - Leigh Creek V HAWKER (at Hawker) - Stableford

"WOMENS BASKETBALL"

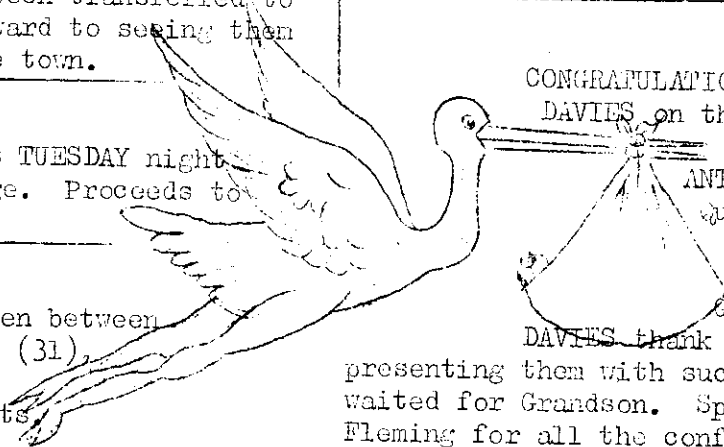

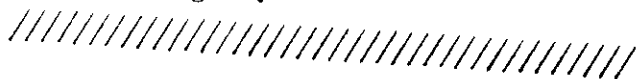
Be sure to sterilise all cutters and saws after cutting diseased wood. Dip them in metho, or boiling water for two minutes. This is a good practice to use between trees at all times as the disease is spread by secatures and saws.

VEGIES

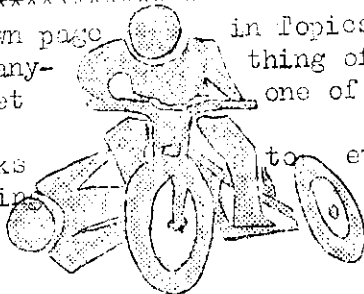
In the vegetable garden, things are rather winterish these frosty mornings, so don't plant your summer vegies e.g. tomatoes, cucumbers, sweet corn or beans for a few more weeks. Seedlings of very early tomatoes may be raised in boxes, but be sure to bring them in at night or the frost will put a quick end to your efforts.

Peas may still be planted and winter lettuce, though it is now a bit late for cabbages and cauliflower.

Now is the time to get things ready for the summer crops. Dig the soil well and incorporate a good cup-full of complete fertiliser per square yard. Be prepared for a flying start in late August.

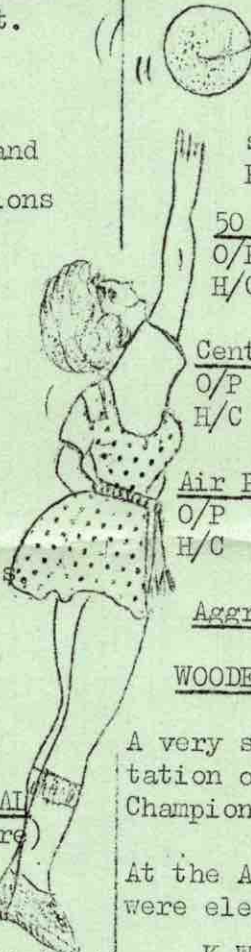

SELF SAUCE LEMON PUDDING

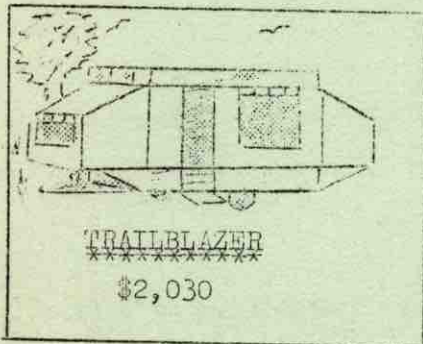
- 2 ozs Margarine

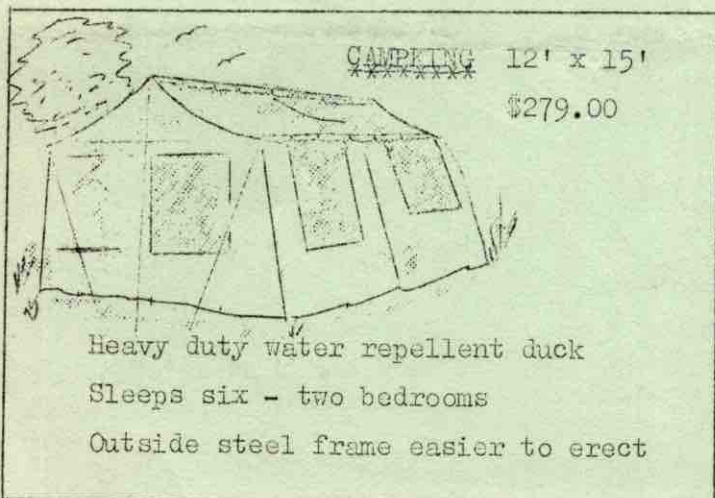
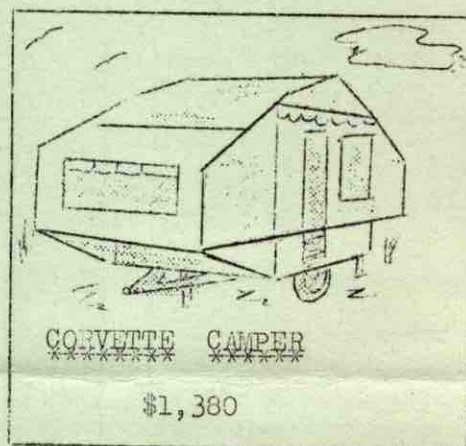
