# FAR NORTHERN DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION F.N.D.A. Meeting 19 June 1972

At a committee meeting of the above on 19 June 1972, the Flinders Ranges Planning Area Development Plan was discussed and we wish the following points to be considered:-

- The official inspection group due to visit the area during July 1972 allow sufficient time for as many as possible informal discussions with residents and representative groups of the area.
- No doubt a body of people will be set up to control the area, it is this committee's 2. desire that such a body have equal representation of local residents as with mining, pastoral and tourist interest.
- If Port Augusta were removed from the plan, management of the plan would be greatly 3. simplified.
- It is our opinion that Hawker should be the central point. 4.
- From what we have had confirmed reports, Local Govt. in this area, unless the system 5. is made realistic to values gained, would only increase costs to the land holder with virtually no benefits.
- With areas classified as non-grazing, thought should be given as the whether controll-6. ed grazing would result in the better over-all control of vermin.
- If non-grazing in some areas is decided on, what form of compensation will be made to 7. the land holder:-
  - Rearrangement of leases.
  - In the case of through non-grazing of certain areas a holding becomes too small for economical operation will the lease be purchased as a whole.
- 8. In the case of non-grazing restrictions being applied within a holding what arrangements are anticipated with regard to the erradication of vermin.
- At present we have Wilpena, Arkaroola and a more recent camping area, South of Wilpena 9. what safe-guards are there for the future, with regard to the number of straight tourist organisations setting up business in the area.
- We feel that Copley with the necessary facilities, that is power and water in an ideal location for large scale tourist development. The plan on display at Leigh Creek on 16 June 1972, neither showed or made mention of Copley. 10.

At present there are tourist facilities in and adjacent to Copley, there are none as such at Leigh Creek.

- What compensation is allowed for camping areas within leases. 11.
  - (a) How or who will maintain these areas.
  - b) Will the land holder be expected to maintain them.

(c) If 'B' what payment can be expected for this service.



F.N.D.A. Meeting 19 June 1972 Cont'd ...

Most of the existing watering points are for the express purpose of watering stock, if camping areas are anticipated near these locations, careful consideration should or must be given to:-

The water generally is not acceptable for normal human consumption.

The camping site should be sufficient distance away from the watering points as to not interrupt stock watering.

13. Bush-fire hazard, in a normally dry area this is always a potential danger.

With camping areas will properly constructed barbeques be provided?

(b) Material, sand etc to entinguish the fire.

- (c) Do you anticipate the setting up of fire fighting groups, located at strategic points with the necessary equipment, vehicles etc?
- 14. The policing of all functions within the area will be necessary for smooth operation and administration.
- Road making at present leaves many unsightly diggings on the landscape, with more thought and planning the necessary quarrying could be done in places not conspicous perhaps more transporting will result, but over all a less number of quarrying points will out weight this.
