USE OF WATER IN THE HOME GARDEN

As summer approaches, plants obviously require more water than during the cold months. Some understanding of our climate and plants needs may help in deciding just how much water to put on.

LAWNS - In this hot, dry, area, surface water readily evaporates.
Thus it is important to encourage your lawns to root deep, so as not to be exposed to sudden drying out. Plants roots follow water, and thus a deep rooting system can be encouraged by heavy watering about once a week to allow the water to soak deep into the soil. Frequent light watering encourages shallow roots, and a hot dry spell can do severe dam-

light watering encourages shallow roots, and a hot dry spell can do severe damage. Hardy lawns like Kikuyu, Buffalo grass and Couch like one good soaking once a week, leaving the sprinkler in position for one hour. Softer lawns may require more regular water.

SHRUBS & ROSES - Once again a good weekly watering is best using a sprinkler or letting the hose run slowly in a sunken bed. The use of mulch is most important, as this prevents rapid drying out and improves the soil. Lawn cuttings leaves and grass are very reliable for this purpose.

FRUIT TREES - If young trees are grown in lawns, keep the lawn at least 2 fee back from the tree in order to decrease competition for water and plant food. This is especially important for citrus trees, which do not like fluctuating wet/dry conditions. This is especially important at flowering and early fruit stage. Should the soil dry at this time, the tree may drop many small fruit. Mulching is again of value.

ATMIVALS & VEGETABLES - Seed beds and seedlings need daily hand watering, sometimes 2 or 3 times a day in very hot weather. As they grow, fewer but heavier waterings are required. Furrow or sprinkler irrigation are both O.K. Vegetables generally require more water than annual flowers, and again mulching is important. In summer, vegetables need good watering 2 to 3 times a week and most annual flowers once a week.

DO*** NOT*** WASTE*** WATER

Everyone must co-operate to ensure that water is not wasted. Sliding Rock water will be added to Aroona water as the level of Aroona falls. The proportions will be such that no adverse effects will occur to plants (or people!). However, in times of great water use additional Sliding Rock water may have to be added and this may result in damage to plants. With careful water use by all householders the amount of Sliding Rock water can be kept at a minimum.

Also, excessive water use causes the water table to rise, killing trees that are of great value in a hot, dry climate such as ours.

WATER WELL and WATER WISELY, and remember, we live in a dry area so don't waste water.
