BASKETBALL

By now the results of the 1st round of finals will be known and all teams will be looking towards the GRAND FINAL next WEDNESDAY. Yellow, White and Black all have a very good chance of becoming premiers as they have shown throughout the year that they are capable of playing to premiers standard.

BLUE have not been able to get into the swing of things as much as they would like but I don't think they should be disregarded all together.
