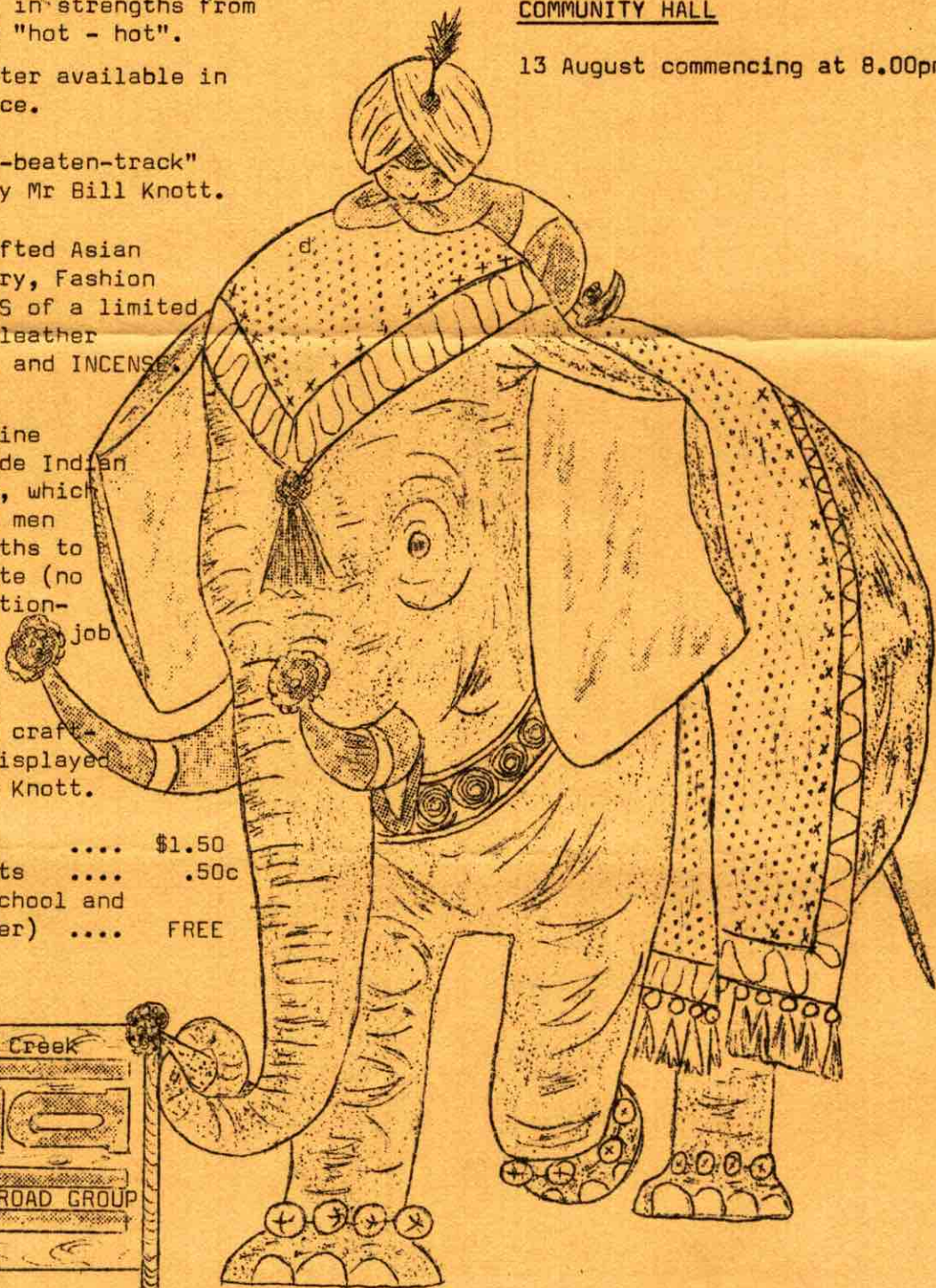

GREEN THUMB

The crisp frosty mornings are starting to subside, the days becoming longer and the odd green shoot starting to appear on the couch grass lawns. Twenty years data shows the monthly mean maximum temp for Aug is 18°C and the mean minimum 5.9°C. Figures for Sept are 22.6 and 9.3°C. So our Spring starts in late August generally and this is the time to get cracking in the garden. Prepare your soils now by applications of animal manure complete fertiliser and dig in to enrich the soil and prepare a seed bed. To get a good early start plant seeds of frost tender crops like tomatoes, capsicums and egg fruit in boxes now and protect from the frost until 3" tall, then plant out. Tomatoes are favourites in Leigh Creek as they yield well and don't mind our climate too much. Gross Lisse is an excellent variety. Carrots can be planted soon. Germination is a problem, but can be assisted by planting seeds in a half inch furrow and covering with sand. The odd radish seed in with the carrots will break the crust and help the more delicate carrots through.
