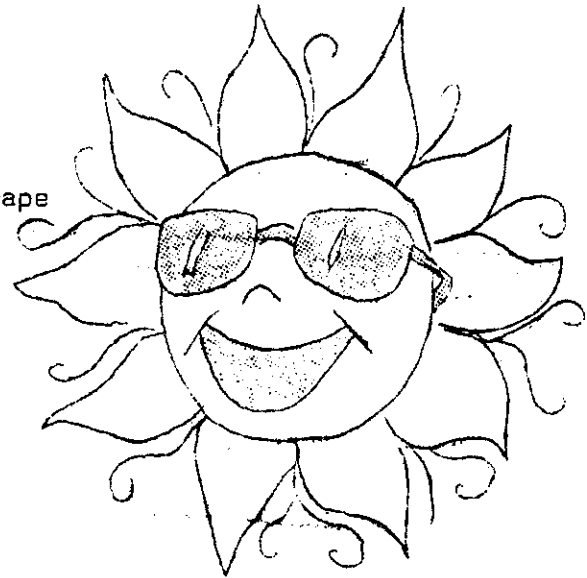

RELOCATION OF LEIGH CREEK

What the Monarto Team is doing

The team has been asked to investigate water use and landscape requirements in the new town. Work to be undertaken is as follows:-

- . Analysis of present water consumption in Leigh Creek.
- . Estimate of water consumption in the new town.
- . Develop strategies for reducing water usage.
- . Assess the feasibility of re-using sewage effluent.
- . Subsurface drainage.
- . Use of rainwater tanks.
- . Develop an overall landscape plan for public areas including buffer zones; guidelines for private area landscaping, park and street planting, irrigation, maintenance and plant specie selection; and a programme for implementation.



Top Soil for the New Town

An order has been placed for the removal of up to 20 000 m³ of Arcoona silt to an area adjacent to the new town. The silt will be used as top soil for future landscaping work.

Town Plan

It is intended that the proposed town plan will be presented to the ETSA Board for their consideration at their next meeting.

Buffer Zone Fences

Tenders have closed for approx 8 km of vermin proof fencing to be erected around the town site. It is hoped that the fencing will be completed by the end of October.

Tree Planting

Approximately 6000 trees have been propagated at Leigh Creek for planting at the new site. Planting out time depends on the availability of water which is presently being arranged. Water has to be piped from the Summit Tank to the town, then reticulated through a system of drippers to the trees. Present indications are that planting will start in October or November this year.

Town Site Traffic

If you visit the town site please keep your vehicle on existing tracks and try to keep your speed down to 20 kph. It would take no time at all to destroy the top surface of the area if vehicles were driven "willy-nilly" over it.

Do you WASH YOUR CAR with a garden hose - or do you use a bucket and rag?

What happens to the rinse water on WASHDAYS? It could supplement the house plants or veg. garden watering.

How long do you stand under the shower - TOO LONG?

How many of us leave a tap running over the hand-basin while we CLEAN OUR TEETH?

These are perhaps only small items to consider, but multiplied by the population of this district, they contribute many thousands of gallons of WASTE each week.

ADVANCE NOTICE - ELECTRICAL POWER OUTAGE

The 132 kV transmission line will be out of service on SUNDAY, 4 September, to allow connection of the new Neuroodla Substation and Hawker, into the ETSA system.
