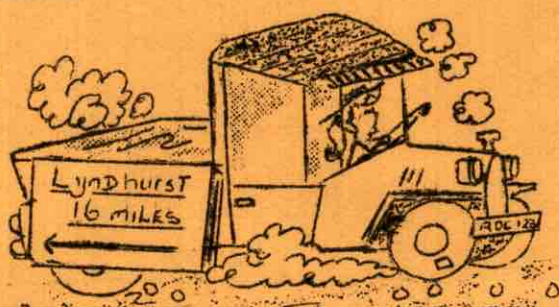

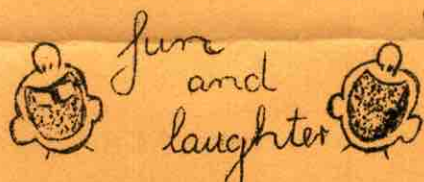

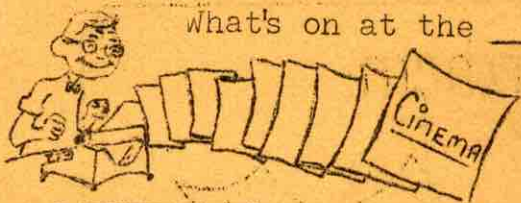

Week series in Adelaide.

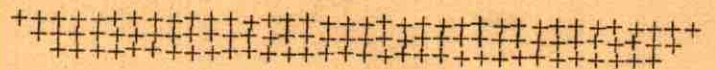

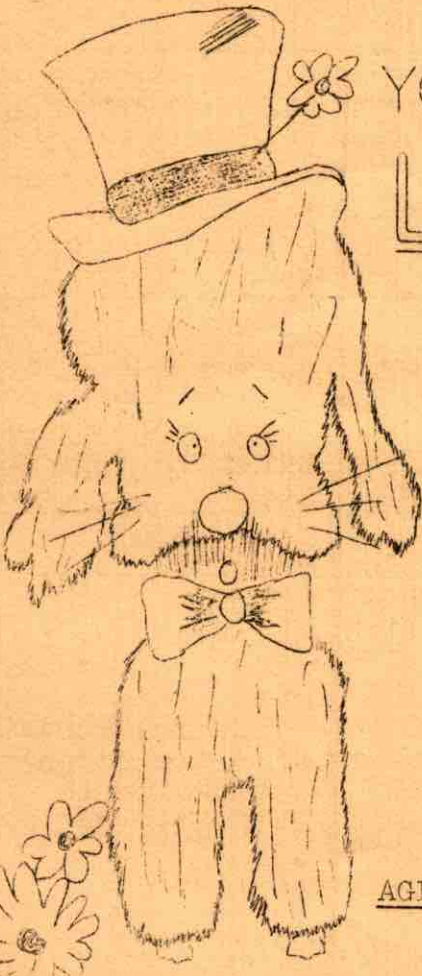

LEIGH CREEK CRICKET CLUB

The Annual General Meeting of the LC Cricket Club was held on Tuesday evening 14th Sept in the supper room. In the absence of our former President (F. Long), the meeting was chaired by T. CERNY. After the minutes of last years AGM were read and accepted and a financial statement presented, the Acting President gave a brief summary of last seasons activities which were very successful. B. BUTTON then proposed a merger between the Cricket Club and the Football Club and gave several reasons why this would be advantageous from the point of view of the former body. This proposal was accepted and another motion was then put through requesting that present office bearers remain until a new constitution is framed incorporating both Clubs.

A SPECIAL FOOTBALL Club meeting then

It is hoped that this will be ready for presentation early in November.

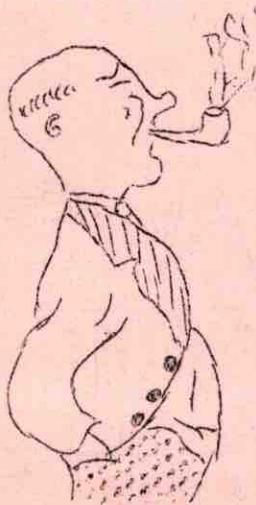

Our next session is on Friday 17th September - 8.0'clock at the RSL Hall, doors closed 8.30 pm.

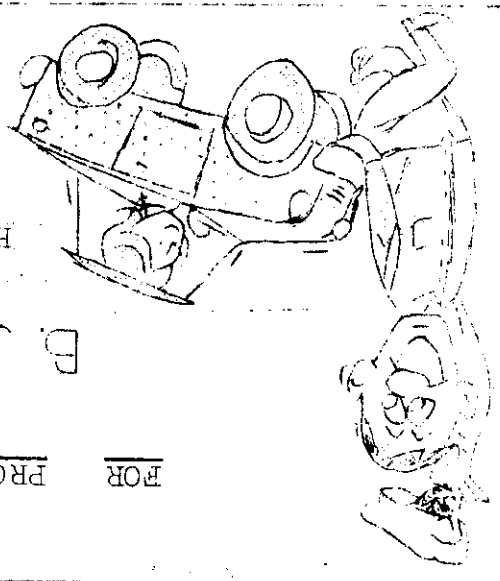
