

'B' Grade - J. Reid d G. Sbona 6 & 5 A. Craigie d T. Miller 1 up


'C' Grade - D. Goodman d G. Gerlach 5 & 4.



#### LEIGH CREEK CRICKET CLUB

The Annual General Meeting of the LC Cricket Club was held on Tuesday evening 14th Sept in the supper room. In the absence of our former President (F. Long), the meeting was chaired by T. CERNY. After the minutes of last years AGM were read and accepted and a financial statement presented, the Acting President gave a brief summary of last seasons activities which were very successful. B. 




