
If you are on a diet, you can win a prize, and then start nibbling at a crust like some ascetic hermit bent on mortifying himself.



Rose Show

On SUNDAY, 5 October 1975, the Garden Club will stage a ROSE SHOW in the Community Hall.

The following Classes will apply -

- 
- Class 1 - Rose, One Bloom - Hybrid Tea
- Class 2 - Rose, three blooms, one variety - Hybrid Tea
- Class 3 - Rose, three buds, different varieties - Hybrid Tea
- Class 4 - Rose, Five stems, three different varieties - Hybrid Tea. Vase or Bowl.
- Class 5 - Rose, full blown, three varieties, three blooms - Hybrid Tea. Vase or Bowl.
- Class 6 - Vase or Bowl of Roses, featuring any two blooms, not more than twelve stems - Hybrid Tea.
- Class 7 - Bowl of mixed Roses, any number.
- Class 8 - Vase or Bowl of Floribunda Roses, any colours, any number of stems. (Grandifloras not accepted).
- Class 9 - An arrangement of mixed fresh flowers. Foliage and leaves allowed. No accessories. Roses not permitted.
- Class 10 - Children up to 8 years old. (An arrangement, with or without foliage, without adult assistance)
- Class 11 - Children 9 - 14 years old. (Age groups as indicated.)

will be accepted between 10.am and 1.30pm. The hall will then be closed for judging 'till 4.00pm when it will be open to the public. Presentation of prizes will commence at 4.30pm.

Green Thumb

With the Rose Show upon us, quality blooms are required. A recent rapid build up of aphids will damage flowers if left unchecked.

Aphids are small insects frequently seen in clusters on young shoots, especially roses. Unlike most insects, they eat by pushing a sharp nose into the plant tissues and sucking up the sap. Since they are very small, and can squeeze into small gaps, they are difficult to control with most dusts and sprays, as the common insecticides must actually come in contact with the insect to kill it. While we may readily kill 90% of them, the few remaining, rapidly breed up again.

The secret to 100% kill of aphids is to spray with a substance that goes into


the sap, then when the aphid takes a sip, he takes in the poison. These types of poisons are called SYSTEMIC, and the best for this purpose is "MALATHION". Care should be taken with this spray, as with all sprays, and that is to keep it off the skin.

Spray on a still day. Malathion spray will also control scale insects and other pests.

Followup sprays may be necessary should the population build up.
