





Health.

Dear Mr Mussared,

Further to your letter of 3rd August, 1973 about a compulsory Chest X-ray Survey for residents at Leigh Creek I advise that there are no plans at present to revisit this part of the State.

Recommendations of the National Tuberculosis Advisory Council are for Compulsory Chest X-ray Surveys to be on a restricted basis. This means that revisits are made to areas where the incidence of Tuberculosis is most likely to be found.

Any residents who are concerned about their chest condition are advised to write to this office giving full details. An authority to attend the Leigh Creek Hospital for X-ray examination will be considered.





Entry forms will be delivered next week and if there are any further inquiries please contact JOHN ZWAR at Admin.


Although recent rough weather has caused some damage in gardens it is hoped that this will not deter people from entering as most gar-dens have been affected by wind damage.






