STEAM TRAIN TO MARREE

On the October long week-end a special steam train will travel on some Commonwealth Railways lines in South Australia. As there are no standard gauge steam locomotives left in S.A., two engines will haul a special train from Sydney to Port Pirie for the tour. On Saturday 7 October one engine will haul a special passenger train on the Whyalla railway which the Prim Minister will declare open the night before. On Sunday 8 October the other engine, a green streamlined Pacific will haul a train from Port Augusta to Marree and return, passing through Telford early in the afternoon. This will be the first standard gauge steam passenger train to Marree and almost certainly the last time a steam train will operate on the Central Australian Railway.

Protection after vaccination is NOT life long, booster vaccinations are recommended, every few years. BE KIND TO YOUR PETS.

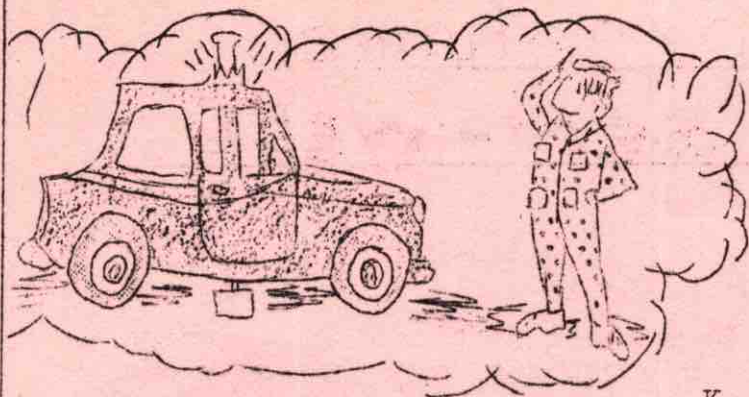

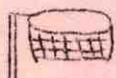

Once again I congratulate the Leigh Creek girls on the way they played together as a team.

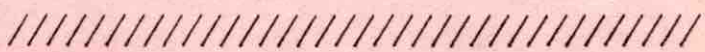
The Iron Knob girls were no match for this combination who could do no wrong. Best for Leigh Creek was
