The present hospital was always intended to be of a temporary nature, as it is really too small and cramped for the work it is called upon to do. However, the Electricity Trust has now decided to build us a new extension, which, coupled with the present part, will make a permanent hospital of which we shall all be proud. The hospital committee has taken upon itself the job of providing the additional furnishings for the hospital which are necessary for the comfort of patients. This of course will need money and willing hands. The committee will want your help in this matter. When they call upon you to support functions or when working bees are organized, please give your help - it will be welcomed. This of course applies to our friends living in the surrounding districts. Don't This of course forget it is your hospital too.

The hospital will be there if you should ever need it - at any time of night or day - now the hospital needs you; please help it all you can.

THE STATE ELECTIONS...are to be held on Saturday, 3rd March.
Leigh Creek residents and all people in the area will be asked to vote for a member in the new-ly formed electorate of Frome.
This electorate has been formed by joining two previous electorates and cutting a bit off the bottom. The new electorate will include such large towns as Peterborough. The previous member of this district was very popular Sir George Jenkins who has since retired. In plebiscite held by the L.C.L. Mr.Ray McAuley of Commodore Station was chosen as the new L.C.L.Candidate for this area. Mr.McAuley is a very popular man and should do very well in this election.

The election battle for Frome will be a very hard fought battle and should prove to be very interesting. The present leader of the S.A.Labour Party and Leader of the Opposition in the South Australian Parliament, The Hon. M.O'Halloran will be opposed by two other candidates - Mr. Ray McAuley L.C.L. and Mr. Pat Hoare Anti-Communist Labour Party.

In a recent interview Mr. Ray McAuley said that his main platform for this area was the fact that he was a resident in the area

and therefore in a better position to have the community's interests at heart than his opponents. Mr. McAuley said that it is for this reason that he decided to stand for Parliament in the first place. He pointed out that the new electorate is a very big one and it will be a very hard job for the successful candidate, but that the people in this area will at least receive conscientious representation if they vote for him.

It is expected that the filter system for the swimming pool will be completed this week.....




