It's a safe bet that you who read this are a drug addict - not, I mean, of opium, alcohol, or even the humble cigarette - but of that most wide-spread modern drug, the printed word. Smoking and drinking are habits usually acquired at an age when perhaps we should have more sense. Reading, however, is one forced upon us willy-nilly in our childhood. By the time we have completed a primary school education we are addicts, and short of blindness or breaking our glasses will never again be free.

Everywhere we go we are assailed by the printed word and we simply can't resist it. How often have you waited on the kerb and found yourself craning to read the up-side-down headlines of a torn and muddy newspaper lying in the gutter? And once aboard your tram or bus, what do you do but read? - if not your own book or newspaper, then the hoardings along the street, the fatuous advertisements inside the vehicle, your neighbour's magazine over his shoulder, or as a last resort your tram ticket! Even those who boast of never reading a book cannot escape this sort of reading: at the worst they tire their eyes or become easy victims of advertising propaganda.

It is no man's place to dictate what another shall like, and if you seriously prefer to read only what is thrust upon you, that is your affair. If however you are of the majority who like to decide for themselves, there is an almost infinite variety of books to suit your age, tastes, and mood: rollicking westerns, murders, science fiction, war anecdotes, biographies, novels, exploration, humour, and serious fact.

Not many years ago in Leigh Creek no reading matter could be bought or borrowed, except the lighter periodicals. To help each other, local members of the Country Women's Association each donated one or two of their own books to form the nucleus of a library. From this small beginning has grown the present Leigh Creek Lending Library, open to anyone in the district and boasting over a thousand volumes of every type (except the purely technical).

Many appeals have been made on this page for public co-operation in town affairs. All the Library asks of you is that you use it. The actual work is done voluntarily by C.W.A. members. There is no profit because every penny is used to buy new books. Obviously the more readers there are, the more money can be spent on new and better books to suit everyone's tastes.

How about looking in the next time you are going to the Cinema?




