When 19-year-old Francis Trudeau fell ill in New York with tuberculosis, the disease was still a deadly mystery, romanticized in such plays as "La Dame aux Camellias", but dreaded by its victims and misunderstood by helpless doctors. That was in 1865, and since there were no nurses trained to care for tuberculosis victims, Francis Trudeau's 16-year-old brother, Edward, took over the task of sitting with him in a stuffy, tightly-sealed room and administering useless cough medicines for four months until Francis died.

Eight years later (by then a doctor with a wife and child) Edward found he had tuberculosis himself. Remembering with horror the airless cell in which his brother suffered, Trudeau moved to Bloomingdale in a remote section of the Adirondack mountains. Inexplicably, he began to recover in the cool fresh air, and in 1885 with £300 borrowed from a friend he opened the United States' first Sanitarium (first patients: two consumptive factory girls).

Through medical research, development of X-Ray, wonder drugs and planned nursing care, tuberculosis has dropped in the last fifty years from the world's second-ranking killer to seventh, and takes only 6% of the lives it took in 1900.

The disease is generally curable. The hope of getting well lies in beginning treatment early. Delay is dangerous. No one should neglect going to a doctor or a clinic if he has any of the warning signs. It is still better to discover the disease before there are any signs.

By taking advantage of Health Department Chest X-Ray Surveys, the doctor's words, 'Early Discovery - Early Treatment - Early Recovery' become a reality, and will reduce still further the incidence of this disease.

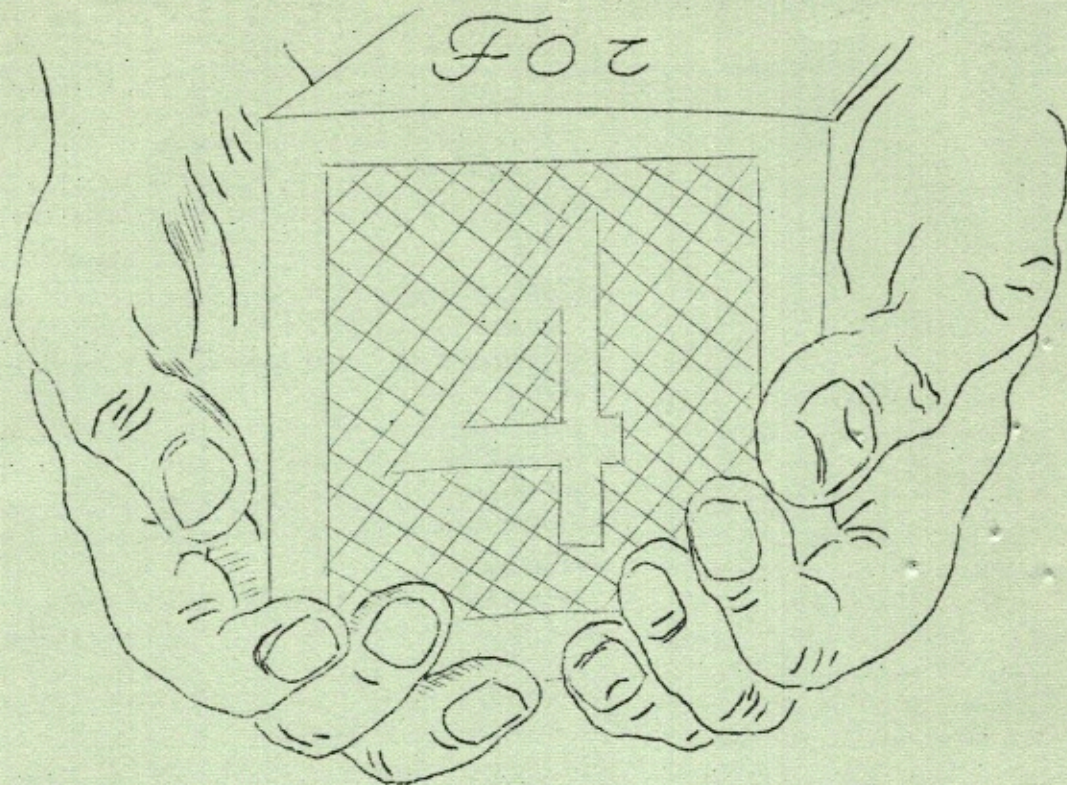

"Sure, an' 'tis so, Murphy. A disgrace to the Irish he was."

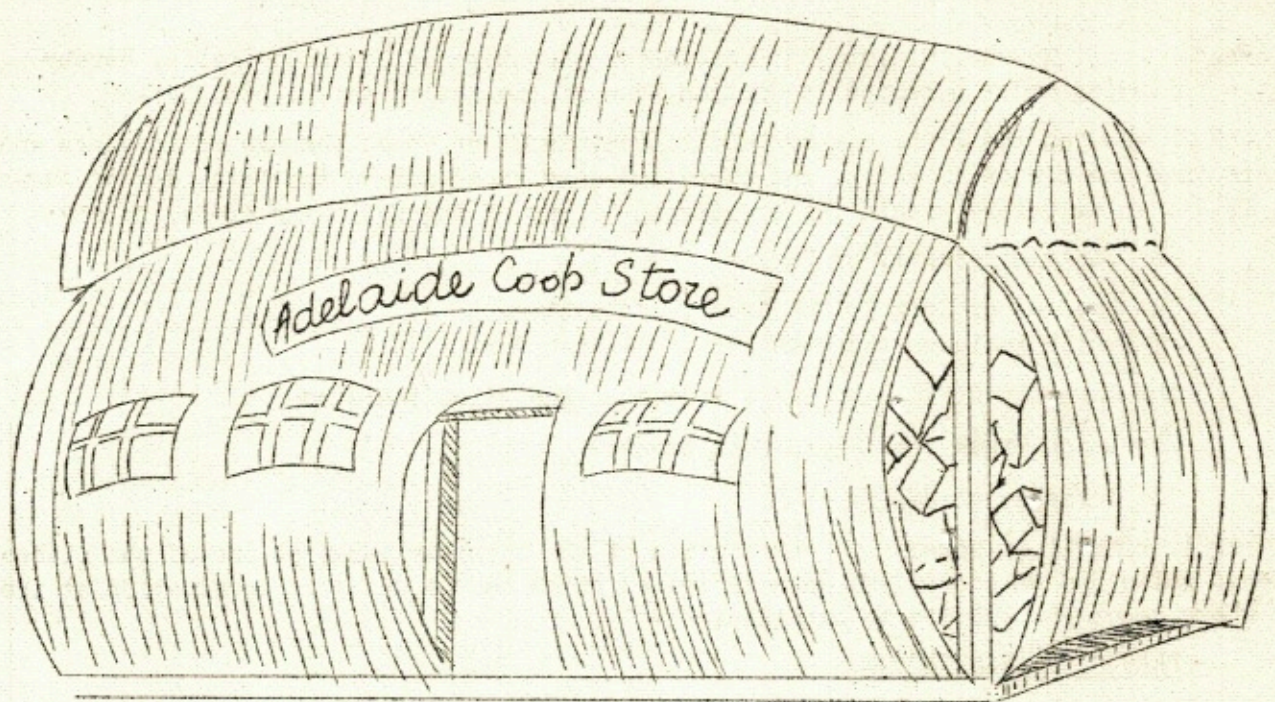
"And Mallory wantin' to fight everybody, is that the truth?"

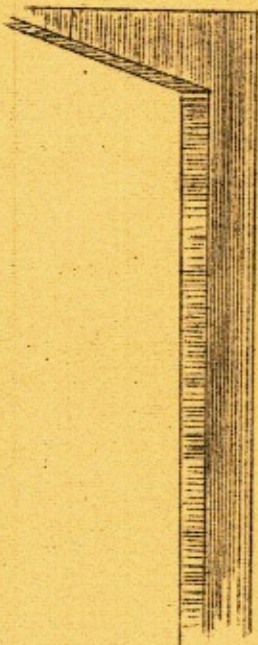

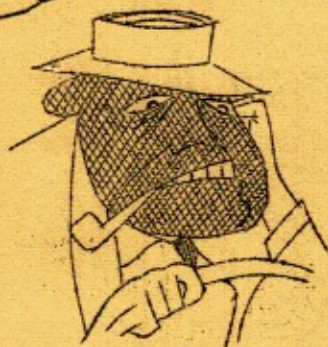

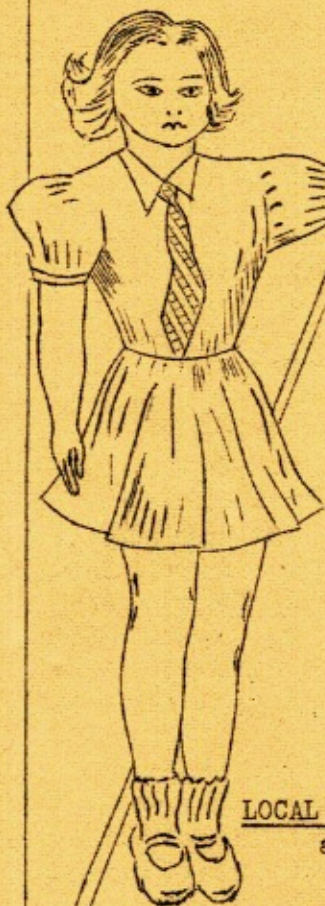
