

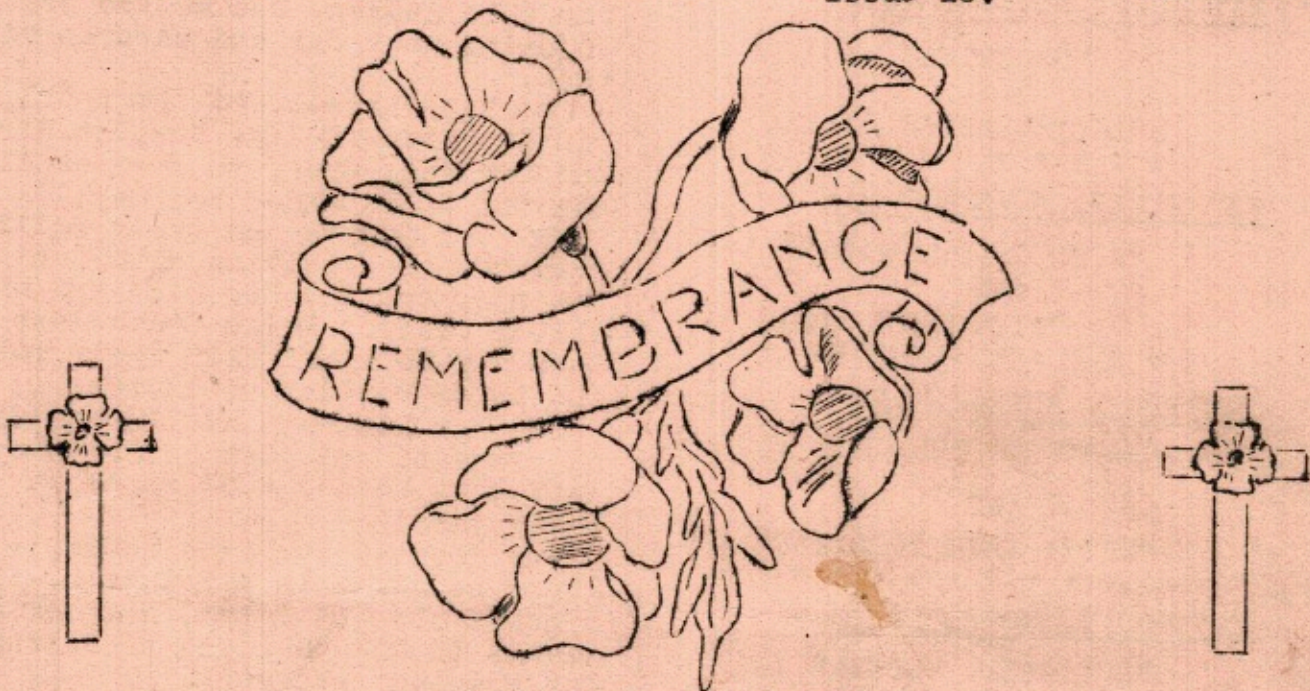

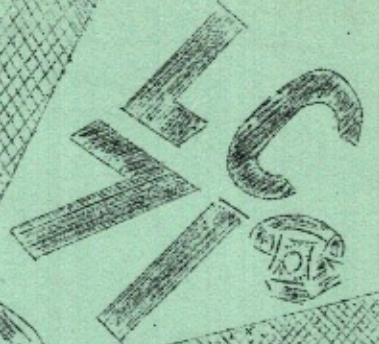

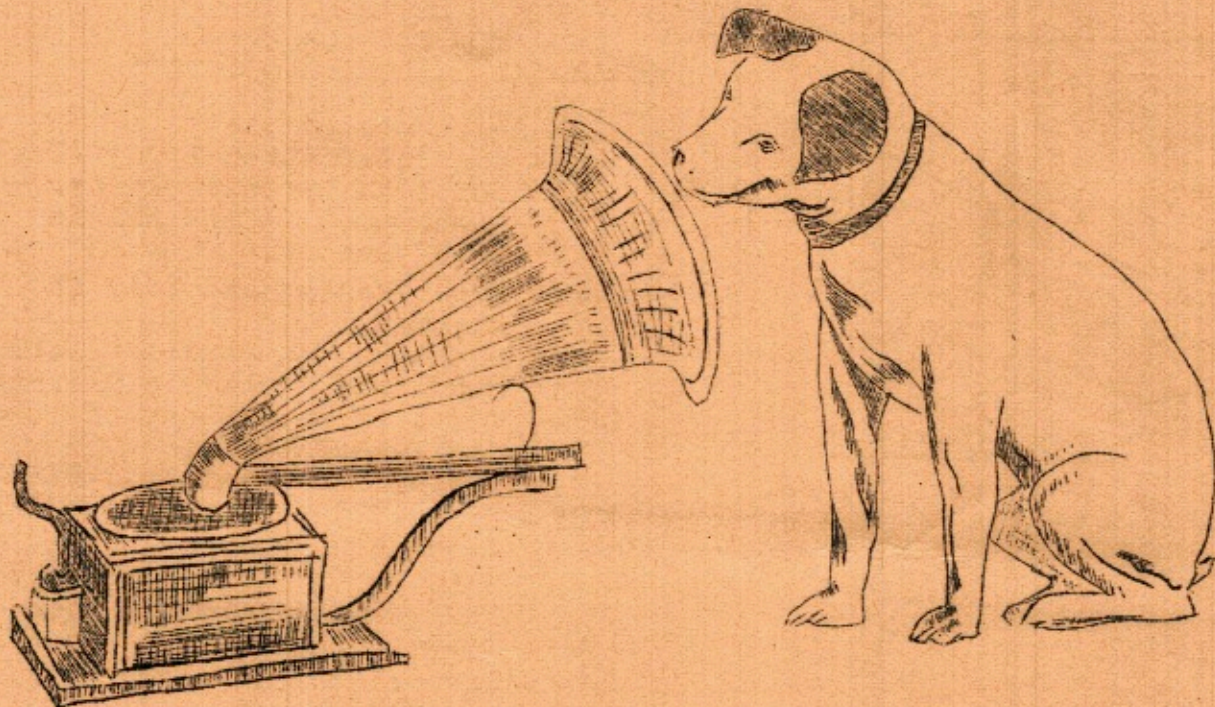

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COINS.

Much in demand by numismatists is the rare British Gothic coin of 1847. It represents one of the Mint's few mistakes. 7000 were made before it was found that the head of the young Queen Victoria was too difficult to strike and the issue was suspended.

TRANSPORT FOR ADELAIDE.

Within a few years King William St. will lose its double tramline and row of centre tram poles and provided motorists are prevented from parking there, this extra space will provide a wider and more open thoroughfare suited to heavier traffic. Buses will draw into the kerb for loading which will have the three-fold advantage of removing the street obstruction of intending passengers, safeguarding them from traffic dangers and helping traffic flow.

Already the first fleet of big modern diesel buses and the showpiece but servicing depot at Hackney have appeared as first visible signs of Adelaide's public transport transformation.

Faced with the problem of transport losses, Adelaide's Tramways Trust Board is methodically placing a modern public transport system and business like management methods into the scale to try to balance the skyrocketed costs and heavy motor car competition.

The deficits, regrettable though they are, compare not unfavourably with those suffered by other utilities elsewhere.

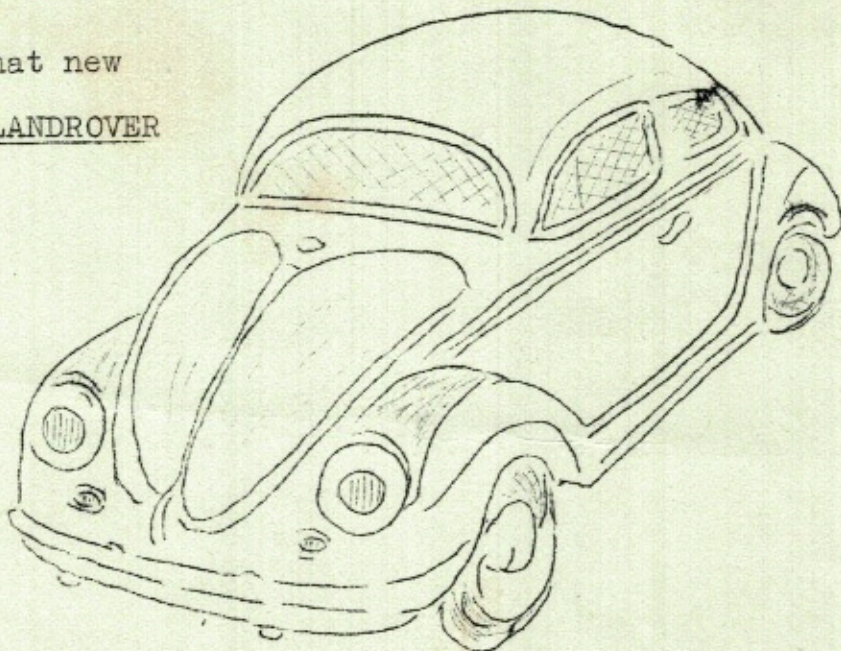

MAKING YOUR WILL..

DON'T DRAW UP YOUR OWN WILL.

"If you want a thing well-done, do it yourself" does not apply to drawing up your Will unless you are a lawyer. A will was invalidated in court lately because the man making the will and his two witnesses had not all signed in the presence of each other.

Here a few traps into which amateurs have fallen:-

+ Wrongly using legal terms, such as writing "issue" when children was intended. "Issue" means dependents, not just the children of the person making the Will.

+ Having as a witness a beneficiary, with no directions on disposal of the Estate should that person die before the testator.

+ Having as a witness a beneficiary under the Will, or the wife or husband of a beneficiary. This invalidates the bequest but not the whole Will.

+ Naming a person of one's own age as an executor is not illegal - but it is unwise; he may die first or be unwilling to act.

Mr. om Randle of R.S.L. League Headquarters advises all service-

men and women that League Welfare can arrange appointments for them or their husbands or wives to have Wills drawn up by the Legal Aid Bureau.

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CHAMPAGNE TABLETS.

A French citizen recently obtained an American patent on a capsule which, when placed in a glass of water, produces an alcoholic drink resembling champagne. The capsule is cased in a mixture of mainly bicarbonate of soda and sugar, and dissolves quickly. The contents are composed of thylie alcoholic, tartaric or citric acid, an aromatic ester and colouring matter. The resulting drink has the same effervescence and sparkle as champagne.

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PULITZER PRIZE.

The annual Pulitzer prizes were established by the will of the American newspaper proprietor, Joseph Pulitzer, who died in 1911. They are awarded for original work in music, drama and literature.
