Have you ever heard the wonder and awe in the voice of a teacher when he says, "I taught that person!" - especially if the person happens to have risen a little above the ordinary?

And it must be a wonderful and satisfying feeling to know that you have opened the door of a subject - and that is about all for which there is time in a child's schooldays - and inspired someone to go on and be interested in all there is to know about it.

A teacher, however, is not a teacher until the very minute he stands alone before his first group of classes, usually somewhere in a remote area. Here, even then, he finds himself still a pupil in many ways, and must learn to apply all his book-learning in front of rows of very critical little bosses, acting of course as though he has been at it for years. There are also the little matters of weekly, monthly, terminal and annual returns and reports with which he so far has not come in contact. The pupils, for their part, are used to a new young teacher every couple of years and find no trouble in remembering all the tricks they put over the last new teacher, although for the life of them they can't remember very much about that history they learned only last term.

The matter of amenities in schools crops up with every generation, and the routine expression to cover the matter is, "The children certainly get it" (meaning their knowledge) "much easier than we did." This is progress, and is as it should be. Why else do the Parents and Friends Committees form? But for all of these wireless lessons, attractive books and projects, there is something missing. Pupils leave school with certificates and then write sloppy, misspelled applications for their first jobs. Is it pride in one's handiwork that isn't there? Or can it be that in this time-saving age any old thing will do so long as it is there.

What has happened to the inspiration of those old folk who laboriously hand-carved chairs... whose beautiful handwork and embroidery still remain in our families after more than a hundred years... the meticulous patience of the hand-written recipe book? What has become of the perseverance that starts a job, enjoys the task and sees it through to a satisfying conclusion?

It is still there in many unsuspected places, and it is up to us as parents and friends to carry on where the teacher has to leave off, and to be able to say with pride and wonder ...
"I taught that person!"

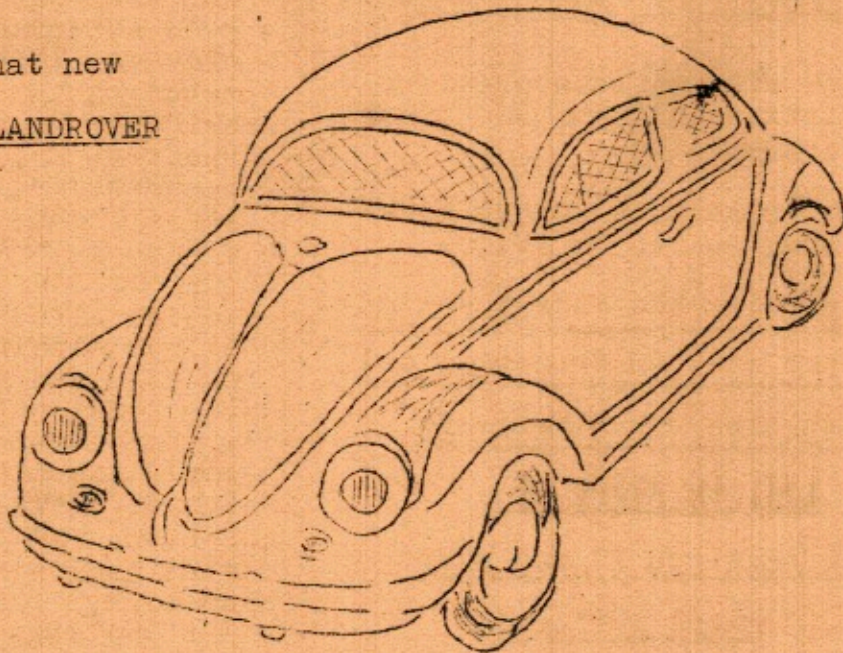
