BOOST FOR WORLD LANGUAGE.

Interest in Esperanto, the easily-learned world language, is being fostered by Russian leaders who have steadfastly ignored it for 70 years.

Esperantists in the Soviet bloc are being asked to spread the language with all their power, according to news received by the British Esperanto Association.

The Soviet Minister for Foreign Affairs, Vyacheslav Molotov, recently showed his personal support by sending a telegram in Esperanto to a communist-sponsored movement in Japan. This was the first official recognition of the language by Russia.

Hungary and other communist Danubian States are now vigorously expounding Esperanto and it will be one of the official languages at next year's Moscow Youth Fes-

tival.

Language experts mainly agree that Esperanto is the easiest of

many so-called world languages. grammar is easily grasped and spelling is phonetic.

WHYALLA'S 27TH SHIP LAUNCHED.

In May, the biggest crowd ever seen at the Whyalla shippard atten-ded the successful launching of the 10,000 ton freighter Iron Spencer in perfect weather. The launching was conducted by Mrs. L.G. Darling of Melbourne.

The Iron Spencer, a sister ship to the Iron Whyalla is the 27th vess el built there in 15 years. It will be used on the Australian coastal run to carry iron ore, coke and steel products.

The vessel was designed by B.H.P's naval architect and staff at the Whyalla shippard and will have a sea speed of 14 knots.
