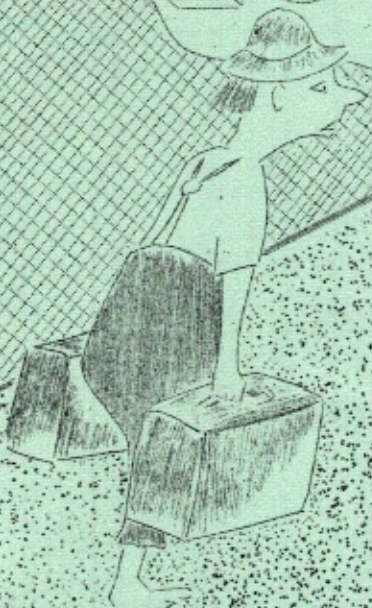
A BAILIFF.

BOOST FOR WORLD LANGUAGE.

Interest in Esperanto, the easily-learned world language, is being fostered by Russian leaders who have steadfastly ignored it for 70 years.

For many reasons - one, probably, that the Russians realise that their own language can never become an international language - the heads of the Soviet State have suddenly become confirmed Esperantists. Their own explanation is that the furthering of a world tongue will aid peace.

Esperantists in the Soviet bloc are being asked to spread the language with all their power, according to news received by the British Esperanto Association.

The Soviet Minister for Foreign Affairs, Vyacheslav Molotov, recently showed his personal support by sending a telegram in Esperanto to a communist-sponsored movement in Japan. This was the first official recognition of the language by Russia.

Hungary and other communist Danubian States are now vigorously expounding Esperanto and it will be one of the official languages at next year's Moscow Youth Festival.

Language experts mainly agree that Esperanto is the easiest of

many so-called world languages. Its grammar is easily grasped and spelling is phonetic.

MIGRANT DOCTORS PRACTICE.

About 250 European-trained doctors have been registered and specially licenced to practise in Australia since the end of 1945.

About 125 were registered after successfully completing the last three or four years of the medical course at an Australian University.

In New South Wales, nine doctors with outstanding qualifications and experience registered without examination.

WHYALLA'S 27TH SHIP LAUNCHED.

In May, the biggest crowd ever seen at the Whyalla shipyard attended the successful launching of the 10,000 ton freighter Iron Spencer in perfect weather. The launching was conducted by Mrs. L.G. Darling of Melbourne.

The Iron Spencer, a sister ship to the Iron Whyalla is the 27th vessel built there in 15 years. It will be used on the Australian coastal run to carry iron ore, coke and steel products.

The vessel was designed by B.H.P.'s naval architect and staff at the Whyalla shipyard and will have a sea speed of 14 knots.
